"MADE IN GRAND FORKS" EXHIBIT IS SURE TO PROVE A REAL EYE OPENER

Brings to the Front Forcibly the Great Array of Industries Possessed by the City—Occupies Important Place in the Auditorium This Week

Grand Forks people and their guests will this week have an opportunity of learning something about the city's commercial activities. The "Made in Grand Forks" exhibit being the means through which this will be accomplished.

The Firms Exhibiting. The Jas. Turner sash and door factory has a fine exhibit of doors and wood work. They have on exhibition several pieces of furniture that are very artistic and fine specimens of the wood workers' art.

The Golden Grain Biscuit company has a display of all of their line of foodstuffs. About a hundred different kinds of cookies and wafers are shown.

The Grand Forks Foundry & Machinery company has one of their gasoline engines in this exhibit. This machine is made entirely in this city. They also have many samples of castings in their display.

The Russell-Miller Milling company has a display of homemade flour made from Grand Forks county wheat that shows up well.

CITY FATHERS MEET IN MONTHLY SESSION

Several Matters of General Interest Were Under Discussion

The city council met in regular monthly session at the council chambers last evening, every alderman being present with the exception of Alderman Sorlie of the Seventh ward.

The residents of paving district No. 15, represented by Attorney F. S. Dugan, presented a petition asking for pavement of parts of Walnut, Chestnut and Cottonwood streets. The petition was referred to the paving committee.

Report on Buildings. The report of the public improvement committee, which criticized the lack of provisions for public safety at the Grand theater, brought forth a lively discussion.

The Grand theater: This place has a seating capacity of 850 with lodge rooms and dance hall on the third floor. The only entrance to the front is a very long hallway having a greatest width of eleven feet, part of which is a stairway five feet high leading up to the lobby.

The bridge committee reported the Minnesota avenue bridge in a dilapidated condition and recommended that a portion of the ice breaks of the bridge be removed in order to permit more free passage of the ice when the river breaks up in the spring.

Street Commissioners Durick in a communication to the council recommended the placing of hitching posts at various places in the city, which recommendation was unanimously shared by the council and the matter was referred to the streets and alleys committee.
