COPPER SAYS THAT CONDITIONS ARE GOOD

Better Farming Expert After Trip Over the State Talks Encouragingly.

"Conditions could scarcely be better so far as soil is concerned," said Secretary Thomas Cooper of the North Dakota Better Farming association, in Fargo yesterday on his return home from an inspection trip through the central and northwest-ern parts of the state.

"In the northwestern part of the state the wheat acreage has been reduced probably about twenty-five per cent, but the crop acreage will be normal and the deficiency in the wheat acreage is made up in increased oats, barley, flax, corn and potato acreage.

"I find in the central part of the state," he continued, "that the corn is practically all planted and that there is a great deal of enthusiasm about potatoes. In Wells, Sheridan, and other counties of that part of the state the potato acreage will be increased fifteen or twenty times that of last year.

"The idea of the visit to Grand Forks has been practically taken up in Crookston and it is expected that a large delegation of boosters from that city will be here for the festival.
