GLASGOW 18, BAYLOR 1
 Eleven runs in the first inning cinched the game for Glasgow Sunday afternoon with Baylor.
 As Baylor had defeated Glasgow earlier in the season, the local boys were determined to show the Baylor team that they could play ball.
 Bardill pitched his first game this season and had everything his own way. Only three hits, were the Baylor boys able to get off his offerings and one score in the ninth totalled their runs during the game.
 During the first five innings the Glasgow team scored eighteen runs, getting eleven in the first inning, two in the second, two in the third, one in the fourth and two in the fifth. The local boys pounded Gritz for fourteen hits, Bardill and Benson each getting three, Herstrom, Movold and Hocking each two and Grace and Bretzke each one. Gritz struck out six and Bardill fooled eleven Baylorites.

CONGRESSIONAL PARTY COMING
 Arrangements have been made by the Commercial Club to have the Congressional Committee of which the Hon. John J. Fitzgerald is chairman include Glasgow as one of their stops

in their tour of inspection of the reclamation projects in the part of the state.
 On July 13th the party will leave Malta in automobiles at 9:00 a. m., to travel along the lower portion of the Dodson South Canal, visit Nelson reservoir, thence to the work in progress on the Nelson reservoir south canal, along the line of the proposed Nelson reservoir south canal and across Beaver Creek Valley to Saco where lunch will be served about 12:30 P. M. After lunch they plan on going to Hinsdale, then along the south bank of the Milk River to Vandalia Diversion, there they will stop 15 minutes, then along the Vandalia south canal and across the irrigable area to Glasgow, stopping to inspect the structures at Vandalia, Tampico and Antelope Creek arriving at Glasgow at 5:00 P. M. and leaving on Number 2 at 7:10 A. M., July 14th.
 The Commercial Club is making arrangements to meet the party at Vandalia and accompany them on their trip into Glasgow where they will be entertained during their short stay.

STATE CROP CONDITIONS
 The outstanding features of the weather of the past week were the excessive rains over the southern and central counties east of the Continental divide and the abnormally low temperatures that prevailed over Montana as a whole. The rainfall over the northern half of the state was less than one inch while the amounts over the southern portion ranged from one to more than four inches. Aside from slight damage to tender vegetation from light frosts that occurred quite generally, no adverse reports worth mentioning have been received during the week. Crops of all kinds made slow growth owing to the cool weather, but all vegetation is further advanced than usual at this time of the year, due to the favorable temperature conditions that prevailed early in the season. In all sections winter wheat is heading and the outlook is highly favorable for a large yield. Streams are high but little water is needed for irrigation.
