### CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

cial Improvement Districts to the General Fund be adopted.

Roll Call, Voting "Yes"—Aldermen Markle, Hurd, Lezie and St. Clair. Carried.

Ordinance No. 179 providing for the transfer from Special Improvement District No. 4 to the General Fund of \$1,500.00 and interest from October 1st, 1911 at 6 per cent on \$500.00 and interest from November 1st, 1911 on \$1,000, was introduced and passed its first reading on motion of Alderman Lezie, seconded by Alderman Hurd.

Roll Call, Voting "Yes"—Aldermen Markle, Hurd, Lezie and St. Clair. Carried.

Ordinance No. 180 providing for the satisfaction of the judgment of the F. C. Austin Drainage Excavator Co., against the City of Glasgow, Montana, said judgment being for the amount of \$2115.52, and interest of \$188.92 or \$2304.44, was introduced and read.

Moved by Alderman Lezie and seconded by Alderman Hurd, that the rules be suspended and the ordinance be passed and adopted as read.

Roll Call, Voting "Yes"—Aldermen Markle, Hurd, Lezie and St. Clair. Carried.

Ordinance No. 181 calling for a special election for the purpose of ascertaining the will of the qualified electors of the City of Glasgow as to whether or not the City of Glasgow shall contract an indebtedness of \$18,000.00 and issue bonds of said City in said sum for the purpose of raising funds, to enlarge and improve the Electric Light Plant of said City of Glasgow, was introduced and read.

It was moved by Alderman Hurd and seconded by Alderman Lezie, that the rule be suspended and that the Ordinance be passed as read, as an Emergency Ordinance.

Roll Call, Voting "Yes"—Aldermen Markle, Hurd, Lezie and St. Clair. Carried.

Ordinance No. 182 providing for the registration of qualified electors for the rule be suspended and that the 4th day of October, 1915, was introduced and read.

It was moved by Alderman Hurd and seconded by Alderman Lezie, that the rules be suspended and that the ordinance be passed as read, as an Emergency Ordinance.

Roll Call, Voting "Yes"—Aldermen Markle, Hurd, Lezie and St. Clair. Carried.

Mrs. John M. Lewis appeared before the Council relative to the Ordinance calling for the closing of Pool-rooms and Billiard Halls on Sunday mornings.

This was referred to the Ordinance Committee.

They were adjourned subject to the call of the chair.

### ORDINANCE NO. 180

AN ORDINANCE Providing for the satisfaction of the Judgment rendered, made, entered and given in the District Court of the Twelfth Judicial District of the State of Montana, in and for the County of Valley, on the 5th day of June, 1914, in the case wherein F. C. Austin Drainage Excavator Company, a corporation, was, and is, plaintiff, and the City of Glasgow, Montana, was, and is, defendant, which judgment was for the sum of Twenty-one hundred fifteen Dollars and Fifty-two cents (\$2,115.52), with interest thereon at the rate of eight per cent per annum from the date of rendition thereof until paid, and providing for the issuance of a warrant upon the General Fund of said City of Glasgow for the payment thereof.

BE IT ORDAINED, By the Council of the City of Glasgow, Montana:

Section 1. That certain judgment duly made, rendered, entered, given and docketed in the District Court of the Twelfth Judicial District of the State of Montana, in and for the County of Valley, in the case wherein F. C. Austin Drainage Excavator Company, a corporation, was, and is, plaintiff, and the City of Glasgow, Montana, was, and is, defendant, on the Fifth day of June, 1914, in favor of said F. C. Austin Drainage Excavator Company, a corporation, and for the sum of Twenty-one hundred fifteen Dollars and Fifty-two cents (\$2,115.52), with interest thereon at the rate of eight per cent per annum from and after the 5th day of June, 1914, until paid, shall forthwith be paid and satisfied out of the General Fund of said city of Glasgow.

Section 2. That the City Clerk of said City of Glasgow, shall issue, immediately after the passage and approval of this ordinance, a warrant for the sum of Twenty-three hundred four Dollars and Forty-four cents, (\$2304.44), being the amount of said judgment with interest accrued to the date of the passage and approval of this ordinance, to-wit: The 17th day of July 1915, in favor of F. C. Austin Drainage Excavator Company upon the General Fund of said City of Glasgow and said Clerk shall deliver the same to said F. C. Austin Drainage Excavator Company, its agent or attorneys, upon being furnished with a satisfaction of said judgment executed and acknowledged in accordance with the statutes of the state of Montana.

Section 3. That said warrant shall be issued in accordance with the statutes of the State of Montana and regulations of the Council of said City of Glasgow and upon presentation thereof to the City Treasurer of said City of Glasgow he shall forthwith pay the same out of the fund upon which it is drawn.

Section 4. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. That an Emergency exists and that this ordinance will be in force from and after its passage by the said City Council.

Passed by said Council this 17th day of July, 1915, and approved by the Mayor this 17th day of July, 1915.

### ORDINANCE NO. 182

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGISTRATION OF QUALIFIED ELECTORS FOR THE SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD WITHIN THE CITY OF GLASGOW, MONTANA, ON MONDAY, THE 4th

DAY OF OCTOBER, 1915, UPON THE QUESTION AS TO WHETHER THE SAID CITY OF GLASGOW SHALL CONTRACT AN INDEBTEDNESS IN THE SUM OF EIGHTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS AND ISSUE BONDS OF SAID CITY OF GLASGOW, THEREFOR, FOR THE PURPOSE OF RAISING FUNDS WITH WHICH TO ENLARGE AND IMPROVE THE ELECTRIC LIGHT PLANT OF SAID CITY OF GLASGOW.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the city council of the city of Glasgow, that all qualified electors within the city of Glasgow, shall register and be registered for the special election to be held on Monday, the 4th day of October, 1915, in said city, upon the question as to whether or not the said city shall contract an indebtedness in the sum of Eighteen Thousand (18,000) Dollars and issue bonds therefore for the purpose of raising funds with which to enlarge and improve the electric light plant of the said city of Glasgow, by the method, in the manner, at the time and by the persons as provided in Chapter 74 of the session laws of the Thirtieth Legislative Assembly of the State of Montana, with respect to special city and municipal elections.

That an Emergency exists and that this ordinance be in full force on and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the city council of the city of Glasgow, and approved by the Mayor of said city of Glasgow, on this 17th day of July, 1915.

### ORDINANCE NO. 181

AN ORDINANCE CALLING AND AUTHORIZING THE HOLDING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION WITHIN AND FOR THE CITY OF GLASGOW, MONTANA, ON MONDAY, THE FOURTH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1915, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ASCERTAINING THE WILL OF THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID CITY OF GLASGOW, AS TO WHETHER OR NOT THE CITY OF GLASGOW SHALL CONTRACT AN INDEBTEDNESS IN THE SUM OF EIGHTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$18,000.00) AND ISSUE BONDS OF SAID CITY IN SAID SUM FOR THE PURPOSE OF RAISING FUNDS TO ENLARGE AND IMPROVE THE ELECTRIC LIGHT PLANT OF SAID CITY OF GLASGOW.

WHEREAS, The Mayor and Council of the City of Glasgow find and deem it necessary to enlarge and improve the electric light plant of said city of Glasgow.

AND WHEREAS, The present Electric Light Plant is inadequate to supply the electricity needed by the consumers in the said city of Glasgow for power and lighting purposes.

AND WHEREAS, It has been determined by the said Mayor and said Council that to obtain the funds required for the purposes aforesaid it is necessary to incur an indebtedness for and on behalf of said city in the sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00); that the total assessed valuation of the taxable property of said city of Glasgow as ascertained by the last assessment for state and county taxes is the sum of Nine Hundred and thirty-five thousand five hundred and fourteen Dollars (\$935,514); THAT said city of Glasgow is indebted at this time in the sum of \$9,000.00 incurred for the purpose of acquiring and constructing an Electric Light Plant for said city of Glasgow; and in the sum of \$50,000 incurred for the purpose of securing and constructing a water plant, water system and water supply for said city of Glasgow; and that said indebtedness in the sum of \$50,000.00, incurred as aforesaid for the purpose of securing and constructing a water plant, water system and water supply for said city of Glasgow, is wholly within the ten per cent limit over and above the three per cent limit as prescribed by subdivision 64 of section 3259 of the revised codes of Montana; and that no part of said indebtedness in the sum of \$50,000.00, incurred as aforesaid for the purpose of securing and constructing a water plant, water system and water supply for said city of Glasgow, is within or constitutes any part of the three per cent limit of indebtedness mentioned in subdivision 64 of section 3259 of the revised codes of Montana; and that said indebtedness in the sum of \$50,000.00, incurred for the purpose of securing and constructing a water plant, water system and water supply for said city of Glasgow, and no part thereof in any way effects the said three per cent limit of indebtedness; and that the foregoing constitutes all of the indebtedness of the said city of Glasgow at this time; and that the aggregate of said indebtedness and proposed indebtedness in the sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.) necessary to enlarge and improve said Electric Light Plant is less than thirteen per cent of the assessed valuation above mentioned; and that the now existing indebtedness of said city of Glasgow and said proposed indebtedness in the sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.) necessary to enlarge and improve said Electric Light Plant is not in excess in the aggregate, exclusive of said indebtedness incurred for the purpose of securing and constructing a water plant, water system and water supply FOR SAID CITY OF GLASGOW, of the three per cent limit of indebtedness prescribed by section 3259 of the revised codes of Montana.

AND WHEREAS, to procure the said sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00), for the purpose aforesaid, it is necessary to issue and sell bonds of said city of Glasgow in that amount in denominations of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) each or multiples thereof payable in not to exceed twenty years from the issuance thereof and redeemable in such time and manner as may be provided for by ordinance to be hereafter passed and approved, prescribing their issuance and the form thereof, and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually,

AND WHEREAS, it is desired to ascertain the will of the qualified electors of said city of Glasgow and to obtain from said qualified electors the authority to incur said indebtedness, and to issue the bonds of said city aforesaid to secure the funds with which to enlarge and improve said Electric Light Plant of said city of Glasgow.

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary to hold a special election within and for said city to ascertain the will of the qualified electors thereof, relative to the enlargement and improvement of said Electric Light Plant and incurring of said indebtedness and issuance of said bonds of said city to obtain funds for said purposes,

AND WHEREAS, it is provided by law that an ordinance, authorizing the calling and holding of said special election for the purposes aforesaid, be passed and approved.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GLASGOW, MONTANA:

Section 1. That a special election shall be held and is hereby called to be held within and for the city of Glasgow, on Monday, the 4th day of October, 1915, for the purpose of ascertaining the will of the qualified electors of said city of Glasgow and that authority may be given and power conferred upon the council of said city to contract an indebtedness for and on behalf of said city which, added to the present existing indebtedness and including the indebtedness of said city incurred for the purpose of constructing a water plant, water system and water supply for said city, is less than thirteen per cent of the assessed valuation of the taxable property situated within the said city and which said proposed indebtedness, added to the present existing indebtedness, but excluding therefrom the indebtedness of said city incurred for the purpose of securing and constructing a water plant, water system and water supply for said city, is not in the aggregate in excess of, but is less than the three per cent limit prescribed by law, by the issuance of electric light bonds of the city of Glasgow, to the amount and in the sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00) for the purpose of enlarging and improving the Electric Light plant of said city of Glasgow, which said Electric Light Plant shall be owned, controlled and operated by said city of Glasgow.

Section 2. That the proposed bonds in the total sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00) and the whole thereof shall be payable in not to exceed twenty years and redeemable in such manner and such time or times as may be provided in the ordinance directing their issuance. The said bonds shall be in denominations of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) each or multiples thereof and bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually.

Section 3. That following the passage, approval and taking effect of this ordinance, the council of the city of Glasgow is hereby directed to cause to be given, and the Mayor and city clerk of said city are hereby required to give, notice that a special election will be held within and for said city, on Monday, the 4th day of October, 1915, for the purpose of determining the will of the voters concerning purposes herein set forth and said notice shall be substantially in the following form:

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD WITHIN AND FOR THE CITY OF GLASGOW, ON MONDAY, THE 4th DAY OF OCTOBER, 1915.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT a special election has been called and will be held within and for the City of Glasgow, on Monday, the Fourth day of October, 1915, for the purpose of submitting to the electors qualified to vote at said election, the question of creating an indebtedness for and on behalf of said city in the sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00) which sum, added to the present existing indebtedness of said city of Glasgow, is less than thirteen per cent of the assessed valuation of the taxable property situated in said city and which said sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.) added to the present existing indebtedness of said city, but excluding therefrom the indebtedness of said city incurred for the purpose of constructing and securing a water plant, water system and water supply for said city, which said indebtedness incurred for the purpose of securing a water plant, water system, and water supply for said city is wholly within the ten per cent additional limit of indebtedness prescribed by law and no part of which is within or effects the three per cent limit fixed by law, is not in the aggregate, in excess of the three per cent limit fixed by law and the issuance and sale of bonds of said city in said sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00) as evidence of said indebtedness, to obtain money with which to enlarge and improve the Electric Light Plant of said city of Glasgow to supply said city of Glasgow with electric current sufficient for its present demands for power and light.

Said bonds shall be in denominations of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) each or some multiple thereof and bearing interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually shall be payable in not to exceed twenty years from the date of issuance and redeemable at the option of said city in the time and manner stated in the ordinance providing for the issuance thereof, and shall be in such form as may be prescribed hereafter by ordinance.

Polling places for said election have been fixed as follows:

First Ward—Back Room of Methodist church, lot 34 and 35, block 66.

Second Ward—Lot 2, block 7, Fricell's Tailor Shop.

Section 4. That said notice referred to in said section 3 shall be given by posting three copies thereof in three most public places in said city by the city clerk on or before the 22nd day of July, 1915, and by publication

of a copy of said notice in the Glasgow Courier, a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in Glasgow, in four successive issues thereof, commencing with the issue of July 23, 1915, and ending with the issue of August 13th, 1915, proof of the posting of the three copies of said notice shall be made by affidavit of the City Clerk showing therein the date and places of posting said copies and the said affidavit shall be filed in the office of the said Clerk, and proof of the printing of said notice in the newspaper above described shall be made by the affidavit of the printer of said newspaper and the dates of publication, and said affidavit shall be filed in the office of the City Clerk.

Section 5. That at said election specified in said notice the ballots to be used shall be of ordinary white paper Five inches by Ten inches in size and in the following form, to-wit: ENLARGEMENT AND IMPROVEMENT OF THE ELECTRIC LIGHT PLANT OF THE CITY OF GLASGOW.

Shall the city of Glasgow, Montana, be authorized to contract an indebtedness in the sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00) for the purpose of raising money to pay for the enlargement and improvement of the Electric Light Plant of said city of Glasgow, which said city shall own and control said Electric Light Plant, and to issue bonds for said indebtedness? "BONDS—YES"..... "BONDS—NO".....

Section 6. If the voter desires to vote for the issuance of said bonds he shall place an "X" opposite the words "Bonds—Yes." If the voter desires to vote against the issuance of said bond he shall place an "X" opposite the words "Bonds—No."

Section 7. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to take any and all necessary steps and do all things required by law for the holding of said special election.

Section 8. That an emergency exists and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force on and after its passage by the council and approval by the Mayor, and said emergency exists in this: that the present Electric Light Plant of the city of Glasgow is inadequate to supply electric current in sufficient quantities to supply and operate the street lighting system of said city of Glasgow and supply the consumers of electric current within the city of Glasgow with the electricity demanded by them for power and lighting purposes, and that the work now required of the present Electric Light Plant is greatly in excess of what it should carry and that said city and residents thereof are in urgent need of a greater supply of electric current at the earliest possible date and that an early election will facilitate the supplying of that need, and for the further reason that it is necessary to commence the enlargement and improvement of said Electric Light Plant at the earliest possible date in order to permit completion thereof previous to the winter season of 1915.

PASSED by the City Council of the City of Glasgow, Montana, and approved by the Mayor thereof this 17th day of July, 1915.
