CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS. Glasgow, Mont., October 13th, 1915. The City Council of the City of Glasgow, Montana, met in regular session in the office of the clerk in the public library building, on the above date at 8 o'clock p. m. Present Mayor Kent, Aldermen Hurd, Markle, Lezie and St. Clair. The minutes of the meeting of September 22nd, were read, also the minutes of the meeting of October 11th, when the Council met as a canvassing board to canvass the returns of the election of October 4th. Approval on motion of Alderman Lezie seconded by St. Clair. Carried.

The bids for the furnishing of the new unit at the light plant were then opened and following bids presented: Allis-Chalmers Co., to install a complete unit as per specifications, \$17,715.00 Busch-Sulzer Co., Diesel engine (only) 15,825.00 General Electric Co., electrical equipment, 2,660.00 Henry R. Worthington, complete unit, 18,000.00 Henry Worthington, engine only, 16,000.00 Power Equipment Co., complete unit 125 KW., 14,600.00 Upon motion by St. Clair and seconded by Lezie, referred to the Light and Water committee.

The following building and moving permits were introduced and allowed on motion of Alderman Lezie, seconded by St. Clair. W. H. Gorgan, trustee, to build addition to Methodist church on lot 34, block 66. Cost \$200.00. Mrs. M. Clough, to build a barn and add "L" to house on lot 3, in block 58. Cost \$50.00. Adolph Behner to build coal shed and addition to house on lot 16, block 8, of Hoffman addition. Cost \$175. Sam Blanchard, to move building from lot 2, block 19 to lot 21, block 14.

The report of the police magistrate and city marshal for the month of September were presented and accepted on motion of Hurd, seconded by St. Clair.

ORDINANCE NO. 189. Entitled "AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF EIGHTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS OF ELECTRIC LIGHT BONDS OF THE CITY OF GLASGOW AND PRESCRIBING THE FORM THEREOF" was introduced by Alderman Hurd and read at length. Thereupon it was moved by Alderman Hurd and seconded by Alderman St. Clair that the rules be suspended and that the ordinance be placed upon its final passage. This motion was carried by the unanimous vote of the council.

Thereupon it was moved by Alderman Hurd and seconded by Alderman St. Clair that the ordinance as read do pass. Whereupon the Mayor ordered the city clerk to call the roll and on roll call the following aldermen voted "Yes," Hurd, Lezie, Markle and St. Clair, no aldermen voting "No." Thereupon the Mayor declared said ordinance duly passed and thereafter in the presence of the council, signed

and approved the same, dered to give notice in the following ing resolution:

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Glasgow, Montana, that the city clerk be directed and ordered to give notice in the following form:

NOTICE OF SALE OF ELECTRIC LIGHT BONDS.

Notice is hereby given that the City of Glasgow, in the State of Montana, on the 24th day of November, 1915, at the hour of twelve o'clock m., at the office of the city clerk of the City of Glasgow, in said City of Glasgow, will offer for sale at public auction and sell to the bidder offering to purchase at the lowest rate of interest electric light bonds of said city in the sum of eighteen thousand and no hundredths dollars (\$18,000.00) which were authorized to be issued and sold by the qualified electors of said city at a special election held within and for said city on the 4th day of October, 1915, which bonds are to be issued and sold to obtain money with which to enlarge and improve the electric light plant of said city of Glasgow.

At such public auction only the bids of bidders who have deposited with the undersigned mayor an unconditional certified check payable to his order for one thousand dollars, will be considered. The checks of all unsuccessful bidders will be returned forthwith, whereas the check of the successful bidder or bidders shall be held by the city and forfeited to it should the purchaser fail to take up and pay for said bonds when presented to him.

That said bonds to be sold are of the denomination of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) each, numbered one to eighteen inclusive, dated the 1st day of January, 1916, bearing not to exceed six per cent interest per annum, payable semi-annually on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July of each year after the date of issuance.

Said bonds and interest coupons thereto attached are payable at the office of the treasurer of said city, or at the option of the purchaser or owner thereof, at the Bank, New York City, New York, and are payable January 1st, 1936, and redeemable at the option of said city on or at any time after January 1st, 1926, on giving notice in writing by said city to the holders of said bonds of at least thirty days at the place where said bonds are payable, and said bonds and interest thereupon are payable in gold coin of the present standard weight and fineness.

The present City Council of said city reserves the right to reject any and all bids made for said bonds and to re-advertise and again sell the same in the event that a satisfactory price is not bid therefor.
