AMERICA'S LARGEST TREES FOUND DURING CONTEST

Much data of general interest and of considerable value to foresters has been collected as a result of a big-tree contest recently conducted by the American Genetic association. Several hundred photographs and descriptions of large and unusual native trees in various parts of the country were submitted to the organization during the course of its competition, and through the information thus gathered a number of exceptional specimens of certain species have been "discovered." The contest embraced a search for the largest nut-bearing trees in this country, excluding the gigantic Sequoias of the Pacific coast, which for size surpass all other trees in the world. The results of the contest and pictures of the prize-winning trees are published in the March Popular Mechanics magazine.

What undoubtedly is the largest deciduous tree now growing in the United States is a sycamore near Worthington, Indiana, which at five feet from the ground measures 42 feet 3 inches in circumference. Its height is approximately 150 feet. According to local claims this remarkable specimen is inferior to one long since felled in the same district which had

a girth of 67 feet. A valley oak, which measures 37 feet 6 inches in circumference, was the largest nut-bearing tree found during the contest. This is situated in San Benito, county, California, and reaches to a height of 125 feet. In a good season it bears a ton of acorns. America's largest elm seems to be "The Great Elm" at Wethersfield, Connecticut, which at the base has a circumference of over 55 feet. It is supposed to be about 250 years old.
