hardships and death—that this nation shall maintain the principles of freedom, speaks volumes for their bravery and self-sacrifice. No more sorrowful scene has ever been witnessed in Glasgow than the farewell of loved ones just before Company G departed. Not a dry eye was seen in that vast assemblage drawn together to bid the boys good bye, and strong men wept beside mothers and wives, without shame or embarrassment. It was a time for freely giving way to feeling and the pent up sorrow of many trying days was loosed. The prayer on the lips of all was "God preserve you and return you to us."

During the preparations made by Company G to depart Leo B. Coleman called upon the business men of Glasgow and secured donations from them of fruit, candy, tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, etc., besides a cash contribution of over one hundred dollars, to be placed in the company canteen fund. Everyone contributed cheerfully for the boys and Mr. Coleman received many expressions of thanks for his efforts on their behalf.

That the members of Company G appreciated the interest shown and attention given them by the Commercial Club and the people of Glasgow was demonstrated by the free sentiment expressed in a letter written and signed by them. It was read at the end of the evening's entertainment, and then, with Miss McCormick leading, all joined in singing "Auld Lang Syne" while Company G marched to quarters to gather their equipment. They left at 12:15 on Train No. 3 to report at Fort Harrison, Helena, where after receiving additional equipment and mustering into regular service, they will be assigned to their departments.

They will remain at Helena until the examinations are completed and necessary equipment arrives for the new recruits.
