commended to be assessed.

P. 40 L. 30—On motion it is hereby ordered that R. P. Holcomb be raised from 15 to 85 head of range horses.

P. 13 L. 19—Frank D. Cooper, Glasgow, appeared and explained the raise recommended on his sheep from 1,800 to 2,400. On motion said assessment is hereby ordered to stand as originally assessed.

P. 39 L. 2—Walter Shanley appeared for the Glasgow Drug Co., in regard to raise in assessment from \$4,000 to \$8,000, and presented a book of inventory of all wares and merchandise of said store. On motion said assessment is hereby ordered raised from \$4,000 to \$4,600.

At 4 o'clock p. m. on motion board adjourned until 10 o'clock p. m., August 12th, 1916.

At 10 o'clock a. m., August 12, 1916, Board of County Commissioners of Valley County, Montana, resumed, all members and the Clerk present.

Board proceeded to take up matters in connection with the equalization of assessment for the year 1916, as follows:

Affidavit of Daniel Knapp swearing that he is the owner of but 29 head of range horses as shown on page 48 line 36 of 1916 assessment book was read and raise ordered cancelled.

Affidavit of Mary L. Cooper that she was the owner of but 1,500 head

of stock sheep March 1, 1916, was read and on motion the proposed raise to 2,500 head as shown on page 32 of Commissioners Journal No. 5 is hereby cancelled.

Upon affidavit the assessment on one stallion belonging to Chas. McVee, page 65 line 1 of assessment book for 1916 is hereby ordered stricken from the rolls.

On affidavit the raise against A. L. Borgerson is hereby cancelled and assessment unchanged.

On motion Clerk & Recorder is hereby ordered to place on the ballot, for the primary nominating election to be held August 29, 1916, the unexpired term of County Commissioner, C. W. Baylor, resigned.

At 12 o'clock noon on motion board took a recess until 2 o'clock p. m. of even date.

At an adjourned meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Valley County, State of Montana, held pursuant to law and the custom of said Board in the Court House at the Town of Glasgow, Valley County, State of Montana, on Saturday the 12th day of August, 1916, at the hour of two o'clock p. m., at which there were present:

Board of County Commissioners, and W. B. Shoemaker, County Clerk and Recorder and ex-officio Clerk of said Board the following proceedings among others were had, to-wit: Commissioner C. J. Anderson introduced the following order and resolution, and moved its adoption, to-wit:

RESOLUTION NO. 3
A RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE FORM AND ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT WARRANTS BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF VALLEY COUNTY:

SECTION 1. All special improvement district warrants from and after the 12th day of August, 1916, and the passage of this resolution shall be in the form and language as follows, to-wit:

Interest at the rate of 6% per annum, payable annually.

SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT COUPON WARRANT.
Issued by the County of Valley, State of Montana.

The treasurer of the County of Valley, State of Montana will pay to _____ or bearer, the sum of _____ dollars, as authorized by resolution No. _____ as passed on the _____ day of _____, 19____, creating

Special Improvement District No. _____, for the construction of the improvements and work performed, as authorized by said resolution to be done in said district, and all laws, resolutions relating thereto in payment of the contract in accordance therewith. The principal and interest of this warrant are payable at the office of the County Treasurer of Valley County, State of Montana, at the town of Glasgow, Valley County, State of Montana.

This warrant bears interest at the rate of six (6) per cent per annum, from the date of registration of this warrant, as expressed herein, and until the date called for redemption by the county treasurer. The interest on this warrant is payable annually on the first day of January in each year, unless paid previous thereto, and as expressed by the interest coupons hereto attached, which bear the original or engraved facsimile signature of the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners and the County Clerk and Recorder of Valley County, State of Montana.

This warrant is payable from the collection of a special tax or assessment, which is a lien against the real estate within said improvement district, as described in said resolution hereinbefore referred to.

This warrant is redeemable at the option of the County, at any time there are funds to the credit of said Special Improvement district fund for the redemption thereof, and in the manner provided for the redemption of the same.

It is hereby certified and recited: that all things required to be done precedent to the issuance of this warrant, have been properly done, happened and been performed, in the manner prescribed by the laws of the State of Montana, and the resolutions of the Board of County Commissioners of Valley County, State of Montana, relating to the issuance thereof. Section 2. All special improvement district warrants and the interest coupons attached thereto shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners and the Clerk and Recorder of Valley County, State of Montana, and the seal of said County shall be affixed to each warrant.

Section 3. All special improvement district warrants may be of denominations of two hundred and fifty (250) dollars, or multiple or fractional parts thereof, as the purpose for which warrants are issued may require.

Section 4. All special improvement district warrants together with the interest coupons attached, for the respective districts against which the same are issued, shall be numbered consecutively beginning with the number one (1) for each district, and designated on the face of the warrant, the respective district, to which such warrants are applicable, and all warrants in call for payment shall be deemed in order of their registration.

Commissioner C. J. Anderson then introduced the following order and resolution and moved its adoption, to-wit:

RESOLUTION NO. 4
A RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT WARRANTS AND prescribing the duties of the COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, COUNTY CLERK AND RECORDER AND COUNTY TREASURER. IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF VALLEY COUNTY:

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Board of County Commissioners of Valley County, State of Montana, to annually levy an assessment and tax for the payment of the principal and interest of all special improvement district Warrants, which may be issued by order of the said Board of County Commissioners on and after the passage and approval of this resolution.

Section 2. Whenever a special improvement district is created by the Board of County Commissioners of Valley County, State of Montana for the purpose of constructing improvements within said district it shall be the duty of the County Clerk and Recorder to open an account against the said improvement district so created, and said account shall be kept in a book provided for the purpose; and in such account the County Clerk and Recorder shall charge all costs and expenses connected therewith, as prescribed in the resolution creating said district; and the County Clerk and Recorder shall issue by direction of the Board of County Commissioners of Valley County, State of Montana, special improvement district warrants of the kind and character described in the resolution relating to the form there-
