Resolution in the Matter of Public Highway Bonds: The Board of County Commissioners of Valley County, Montana, met in Regular Session at the Commissioner's Room in the County Court House in the City of Glasgow, on Wednesday, the 3rd of November, 1920, at 10 o'clock A. M.

There were present Peter A. West, Chairman, and Commissioners Carl J. Anderson and Calvin H. Pippin. C. W. Kamperfer, Clerk and Recorder was also present.

Commissioners Carl J. Anderson, introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption, to-wit: "Whereas, at an election duly called and held in Valley County, Montana, on the Twenty-third day of April, 1920, after notice thereof had been duly given for the time and in the manner required by law, more than a majority of the votes cast were in favor of authorizing the issuance of the bonds of said county in the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) for the purpose of constructing a system of necessary public highways within the said County, and it is desirable at this time to issue and sell Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) of said bonds.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Valley County, Montana, That for the purpose of constructing a system of necessary Public Highways within the said County, there are hereby directed to be issued Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) bonds of said County to be known as Public Highway Bonds, the denomination of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) each, number consecutively from one to fifty inclusive, dated the first day of July, 1920, and becoming due July 1st 1940; the said County reserving the right to pay and redeem said bonds in the order of their numbers in the following order, to-wit: \$5000.00 on July 1st in each of the years from 1921 to 1939 inclusive, or any interest payment date thereafter and on July 1st, 1939 or January 1st, 1940 the additional and remaining \$5000.00, which said bonds shall bear interest not in excess of six per cent annum payable semi-annually on the first day of January and July of each year, and both principal and interest of said bonds to be made payable at the Glasgow National Bank, in the City of New York, N. Y., at the option of the purchaser.

Said bonds shall be sealed with the County Seal, and said bonds and coupons shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners and by the County Treasurer and countersigned by the County Clerk; and said bonds shall be in substantially the following form:

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA STATE OF MONTANA VALLEY COUNTY PUBLIC HIGHWAY BOND

Know all men by these presents that the County of Valley, in the State of Montana, for value received hereby promises to pay to bearer One Thousand Dollars lawful money of the United States of America, on the First day of July, 1940, with interest on the said sum from the date hereof until paid at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of January and July in each year on presentation and surrender of the interest coupons hereto attached. Both principal and interest of this bond are made payable at the Liberty National Bank in the City of New York, State of New York. The said County reserves the right to redeem this bond on the first day of July 19... or on any interest payment date thereafter, said redemption to be made after notice given as provided in Section 2911 of the Revised Code of Montana, 1907.

This bond is issued by the County of Valley for the purpose of constructing a system of necessary public Highways within said County, pursuant to the provisions of Section 2905 et seq. of the Political Code of Montana 1907, and of an election duly called and held on the 23rd day of April, 1920, and in conformity with a Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of said County duly passed.

And it is hereby certified and recited that all the conditions and things required by the laws and the constitution of the State of Montana to be done precedent to and in the issuance of this bond have been properly done, happened and performed in regular and due form as required by law, and that the interest on this bond, does not exceed the constitutional or statutory limitations.


