

PROTESTANT CHURCHES ADOPT UNIFORM MISSIONARY PROGRAM

At a recent meeting of the Woman's Council, at which representatives from all the Protestant churches of the city were present, a plan was formulated to adopt a uniform program of missionary work to be carried out by the missionary societies of all the Protestant churches.

The work of the year is divided into two periods. The first period, which ends January 1, will be under the supervision of the Woman's Home Missionary Society and the latter part of the year will be given over to the consideration of the work of the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society.

The study periods of the Home Missionary societies are occupied at present with the book entitled "Trend of the Races," by Rev. Geo. E. Haynes, Ph. D. The treatise is on the negro question. The author, a highly educated member of the race, writes on the subject from personal experience and research and also from valuable information obtained from other writers.

The Congregational, Methodist and Baptist churches of this city are presenting worth while and interesting missionary programs the last part of the afternoon which they hold their Ladies Aid meetings and Miss Mary Sandell, who has charge of the work of the Baptist church, has added much to these meetings in presenting interesting and comprehensive reviews of the book, "Trend of the Races."

Christmas boxes are being prepared and sent to missionaries in foreign fields to be distributed among the children and financial aid is given through mite box collections, the sums realized from this source being sent to the missionary headquarters for use in both the home and foreign mission work.

THE STATE'S OIL LAND

There are two producing oil wells located on Montana state school land from which the state receives royalties on the production.

Since August, 1921, the first well has paid the state \$2,759 in royalties and the second well, brought in in August, 1922, is producing 200 barrels a day on which the state receives a 10 per cent royalty.

In addition to royalty from producing oil wells, the state for cash rentals upon oil land leases up to June 30, 1922, the close of the fiscal year, had issued 349 old form leases on school lands from which it received \$32,277 in rentals and 92 new form leases from which it had received \$26,925 in rentals, or a total of \$59,203 from 441 leases on 211,135 acres of land. Since June 30, it has issued about 100 more leases.

BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MONTANA - A PROCLAMATION. By virtue of the authority in me vested by the Constitution and the Laws of the State of Montana, I, Jos. M. Dixon, Governor of said State, do hereby proclaim that on Tuesday, the seventh day of November, A. D. 1922, there will be held in the State of Montana a General Election by the qualified electors of said State, to elect the following officers, to-wit:

One United States Senator. One Representative in Congress for the First Congressional District. One Representative in Congress for the Second Congressional District. One Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. One Associate Justice of the Supreme Court. One Clerk of the Supreme Court. One Railroad Commissioner. One State Senator in each of the following counties, to-wit: Broadwater, Cascade, Chouteau, Fallon, Fergus, Flathead, Granite, Jefferson, Lincoln, Madison, Mineral, Missoula, Ravalli, Judith Basin, Richland, Rosebud, Sanders, Sheridan, Silver Bow, Stillwater, Teton, Toole, Valley, Wheatland, Wibaux, Yellowstone and the county of Park to fill the existing vacancies, to-wit: Members of the House of Representatives for the several counties of the state, as follows:

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qualified electors of the State as said General Election Referendum Measure No. 25, which is a reference to the people by the Legislative Assembly of House Bill No. 193 being Chapter 162 of the Laws of the Seventeenth Legislative Assembly, and being an Act entitled:

"An Act providing for the payment of equalized compensation to each soldier who served in the Military or Naval forces of the United States during the war between the United States and the German Empire and its allies between the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and seventeen, and the eleventh day of November, nineteen hundred and eighteen; authorizing the State of Montana to become indebted in the sum of four million five hundred thousand dollars (\$4,500,000) in excess of the constitutional limit over and above any bonded indebtedness herebefore created or created and for which said State is now obligated; providing for the issuance and sale of bonds of and in the name of the State of Montana in the sum of four million five hundred thousand dollars (\$4,500,000) to acquire funds for the payment of said equalized compensation; prescribing the form of such bond; providing for the creation of a fund to pay the principal and interest of said bonds by levying a sufficient annual tax to pay the principal and interest accruing thereon; making an appropriation; providing penalties; providing for the submission to the qualified electors of the State of Montana at the next General or Special Election the question of the issuance of such bonds and describing the form of ballot to be used and the duties of the State Board of Examiners relative to the issuance of such bonds and the duties of the Secretary of the State of Montana relative to the submission of said question to the qualified electors of said State."

There will also be submitted to the qualified electors of the State at said General Election Initiative Measure No. 26, entitled:

"An Act to amend Section 11180 of the Revised Codes of Montana of 1921, relating to wages, for the purpose of assisting State and County Fairs conducting agricultural and livestock exhibitions."

At said General Election there will be elected the following officers in each county, to-wit: One County Commissioner for a term of six years; one Sheriff; one County Clerk; one County Treasurer; one Assessor; one County Attorney; one County Superintendent of Common Schools; one Coroner; one Public Administrator; one County Surveyor; one County Auditor in each county of the state entitled to such office; and in Judith Basin County one Clerk of the District Court for a term of two years, one Commissioner for a term of two years, and one Commissioner for a term of four years.

Officers will also be elected at said General Election to fill any vacancies existing in any State or County office where such vacancy exists otherwise than by expiration of term of office.

Also to determine any local question to be submitted to the electors of any county.

And in order that such election may be conducted in a quiet and orderly manner I hereby offer a reward of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for the arrest and conviction of any person violating any of the provisions of Part I, Chapters 5 and 6, of the Penal Code, such reward to be paid upon the total amount hereafter expended for such purposes reaches the sum of Five Thousand Dollars.
