### Coast Auto Line Is Probable

J. D. Bell of the Nash Hotel at Medford has received a folder issued by the Pacific Highway Service Company, otherwise known as the Jitney auto route. It gives a map of the route from Puget Sound to Golden Gate, a distance of 942 miles. It shows the principal towns, scenic attractions, rivers, etc., and gives descriptions of the same.

It will take six days to make the trip from Seattle to San Francisco and passengers can stop off at any station and take in the side trips. Special attention is called to the Crater Lake trip from Medford. The service starts May 1 and is advertised as the finest auto trip in all the world. At 3 cents per mile, which is to be the charge, it will cost \$28.26 for fare, according to the map schedule, from Seattle to San Francisco and \$12.90 from Medford. The schedule shows 430 miles from Medford, which requires about a three days' trip.

Several thousand of these folders will be distributed all over the United States and it promises to be a very popular route to the Panama-Pacific exposition, comprising, as it does, some of the most picturesque scenery in the world.

This auto route to the fair was looked upon locally as an improbability when first announced, but it seems that the backers intend to put it through, and Ashland may see numbers of tourists stop off here, attracted by the beauty of the city and by the mineral waters, which are sure to be a great drawing card for auto tourists.

### Rogue Apples at The Exposition

San Francisco.—Rogue river apples are being served at the table of several exposition officials by courtesy of the fruit exhibitors in the Oregon building.

Since automobiles are not allowed on the fair grounds, signal honors were given the Rogue river apple, when a special permit allowed the Oregon product to enter the rounds in an auto, with Claude McGee of the Howard Auto Company as pilot. Geo. M. Hyland, managing secretary of the Oregon commission, and J. A. Frohbach of Ashland donated the fruit.

The Ashland railroaders who attended Southern Pacific day at the exposition report a monster attendance of railroaders from all along the line.

One of the clerks employed in the local offices spent a few spare minutes the other evening in figuring up some very interesting statistics. He found that the freight cars of the Pennsylvania Lines, should they be placed in one train, would reach from Ashland to El Paso, Texas, a distance of about 1,800 miles. If it were possible to move such a train the engine on the front end would have progressed fifty miles before the slack would be taken up and the back car moved.

The Canadian Pacific private car "Nova Scotia," with Vice-President McNicoll and party on board, were here during the terminal stop Wednesday afternoon, southbound to San Francisco and San Diego. The touring officials were on a trip which had its inception way over among the maritime provinces on the Atlantic seaboard, extending over the company's own lines to Vancouver, B. C., and thence homeward by a devious route.
