

WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY

Bulletins of the Yacht Race Transmitted to New York.

INVENTOR MARCONI SATISFIED

Experiment Caused Great Interest and Representatives of the Army and Navy Were Present.

G. Marconi, who arrived in this city from England a few days ago for the purpose of transmitting bulletins of the international yacht race by means of his system of wireless telegraph, yesterday successfully accomplished his object, says the New York Tribune.

Many of the messages reached their destination within fifteen seconds of their transmission. Signor Marconi had his apparatus on board the steamship Ponce.

Signor Marconi said, when asked as to the result of the experiment after the race: "It worked very well indeed. We sent all the messages as they were sent to us."

The experiment caused great interest among those on board the vessel. Before the race started stock quotations were received on board and posted in the smoking room.

The United States army and signal corps and the navy were officially represented. The signal corps was represented by Captain L. D. Wildman and Carl Kinsley, and the navy by Lieutenant Commander Edward F. Quil-trough and Lieutenant Blish.

As the vessel drew down toward the immense fleet of excursion craft and yachts, ranging from ocean steamers to tugs and oyster steamers, the interest began to rise.

No group on board watched the race more closely than one standing upon the forward deck. It was composed of several Canadians who had come to New York for the purpose of seeing the race.

Again their countenances fell as the Columbia was seen to be drawing ahead. "How far is it to the finishing line?" anxiously inquired they.

The result now seemed so obvious that their interest in the race began to flag. Soon they descended from the forward deck and disappeared below.


