THUNDER MOUNTAIN A FAKE

Mr. Tucker of This City Says There Is Nothing in It.

William Tucker, who has been in Baker City since last August, arrived home yesterday and does not have a very flattering story to tell about Thunder Mountain. He has been in a good position to observe the conditions there and says it is a good place to stay away from.

In the first place the ore produced is of the poorest grade and consequently not a heavy paying class; everybody expects to get rich and so thoroughly are they imbued with this idea that they are locating claims where the snow is ten feet deep, and post their notices on trees; they have never seen the ground only through the X-ray of imagination, but simply know that they are going to get rich. There are no placer mines in the section and men have to work hard to get what little profit there is. A large claim there is not worth anything compared with a little claim near Baker City, where gold of the first grade is found. Furthermore, the expense of getting machinery there would eat up the output of twenty claims and it would be hard work to produce enough income from the mines to pay for the outfit. Mr. Tucker did not think the section worthy of consideration while he was in Baker City, which is in fact one of the easiest and shortest approaches to the section. The other way of getting in, which is as short as the Baker route but not so easy, is by way of Boise City.

The idea that Thunder Mountain is a placer section is all hush, according to Mr. Tucker's idea.

unfair to expel those now engaged in business under the flag. He said that all persons in the archipelago were entitled to worship as they pleased and that the press was now free.

When they accepted peace, he explained, they would have civil government and a greater degree of liberty. Guevara and his party accepted these explanations and promised to surrender April 15. He then escorted the American officers to a banquet, which was served with cloth napkins and other adjuncts of civilization. General Smith gave Guevara permission to purchase rice for the use of the insurgent troops.

MARIETTA O.

April 9.—The largest gas and oil land deal ever made in this city has just been consummated, whereby the Ohio & California Refining Company has acquired 50,000 acres of oil and gas land in West Virginia. The price is said to be very large.

IRROQUOIS PROBABLY LOST.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 9.—Word received here of the lost American ship Iroquois, in Javaas. The Iroquois was commanded by Captain Thompson, of this city, and was manned by thirty men. The dispatch does not report the safety of the crew and it is feared they were lost. The Iroquois was bound from New York to Tien Tain, China.
