

ANTARCTIC EXPLORATION.

LONDON, Sept. 17.—The Scottish National Antarctic Association, under the leadership of William C. Bruce, director of Laboratory of Marine Zoology, Edinburgh, has completed arrangements to sail for the Antarctic regions on the auxiliary screw steamer Scotia, early in October. The ship is splendidly equipped and has several novel features, including an apparatus for taking birdseye views from kites, moving picture machines for obtaining records of the movements of South Sea organisms and 6000 fathoms of cable with the object of sounding the ocean, where Sir James Ross failed to find bottom with 4000 fathoms.

STEAMSHIP LINES STILL CONFER.

NEW YORK, Sept. 17.—A dispatch to the Reuter's Telegram Company from Ostend, Belgium, says the reported conference there September 16 of the managers of the steamship lines plying between Europe and South America was not convened and that no shipowners have arrived as Ostend. A dispatch to the Daily Mail from Hamburg says there is the best authority for asserting that the conference will occur as soon as outstanding differences of opinion have been settled. The Mail correspondent announces the departure of Herr Ballin, general director of the Hamburg-American line for Ostend.

DYNAMITE WINS.

SEATTLE, Sept. 17.—A special from Skagway says: Yesterday afternoon a man walked into the Canadian Bank of Commerce, a revolver in one hand and a stick of dynamite in the other and demanded \$20,000. Two of the employees of the bank started to run when the man dropped the dynamite, wrecking the bank.

BOXERS START AGAIN.

LONDON, Sept. 17.—Cutting from Shanghai the correspondent of the Daily Mail says that Chen Tufo, the capital of the province of Szechuen, is surrounded by 50,000 Boxers, but that their attempts to take the city have so far failed. Without immediate help, however, Cheng Tufo must fall.

SHIPBUILDING SLACK.

LONDON, Sept. 17.—Because of the fact that the condition of the shipbuilding trade is growing worse the federated employers of Tyne, Wear, Teas and Hartlepool districts have notified their employees that they must reduce their wages.

POOR ROCKEFELLER LOSES \$40,000.

TARRYTOWN, N. Y., Sept. 17.—The residence of John D. Rockefeller at Pocantico Hills, Westchester county, was destroyed by fire today. The fire is supposed to have started from a crossed electric wire. The loss is \$40,000.

UP A TREE.

CHICAGO, Sept. 17.—The American Cycle Manufacturing Company, owner of the largest bicycle factory in Chicago, was placed in the hands of receivers today by an order of Judge Jenkins, of Milwaukee. It had a paid up capital of \$5,000,000.
