CONDITION OF THE TREASURY.

Washington, Sept. 30.—Ellis H. Roberts, treasurer of the United States has submitted his report to Secretary Shaw on the condition of the treasury June 3, 1903, and its operations during the past fiscal year. The total net revenues for the year were \$560,356,472, an increase of \$33,985,429 over the preceding year; the total expenditures were \$506,099,907, an increase of \$35,781,024; the surplus was \$54,257,567.
