McKINNON'S MURDERER TAKEN.

P. Girard Captured in California After Exchange of Shots With the Pursuing Officers.

Red Bluff, Cal., Dec. 23.—P. Girard, who is wanted in Sonoma county for the murder of Deputy Sheriff McKinnon, of Harney county, Ore., whom he killed while resisting arrest, near Guernseyville, a few months ago, has been arrested. He had been working on the ranch of Mrs. M. E. Wilcox as wood chopper, and was identified by R. Brower, who chanced to see a photograph of McKinnon's murderer. Sheriff Boyd and City Marshal Ward went to Wilcox' ranch at 3 o'clock in the morning, but found that Girard had fled to the hills. They followed him and after several shots had been exchanged Girard called out that he had been wounded and would surrender, stating that he was the man wanted. He was brought here and lodged in jail pending the arrival of officers from Sonoma county. His wounds are not serious.

Story Pronounced Absurd.

Rome, Dec. 23.—Osservatore Romano, the vatican organ, publishes a semi-official communication characterizing the recent story that millions of dollars had been left to the pope by his predecessor as absurd. The communication says the possible object of the story was to create a false impression of the financial condition of the holy see even more difficult by insinuating that the pope is so rich he does not need the customary offerings of Peter's pence.

Dispensation For New Year's.

Washington, Dec. 23.—The apostolic delegation has received word from Rome that the pope has granted a dispensation from abstinence on New Year's day, which falls on Friday this year.

BRIEF OF STATE IS FILED.

Principal Contentions in Action Instituted Against Northern Securities Company.

Washington, Dec. 23.—The brief of the state of Minnesota in the case of that state against the Northern Securities Company has been filed in the United States supreme court. After stating that the action was brought to enjoin the consolidation of the two railroad companies because they are parallel and competing lines, the attorneys present their assignment of errors.

There are 29 of these assignments, but the principal ones are that the decree is erroneous in holding that the Northern Securities Company was not organized for the purpose of consolidating the two railway companies; in holding that the owning of the stock of the two railway companies by the Northern Securities Company does not amount to consolidation; in holding that the Northern Securities Company does not, in fact, control the two railway companies by virtue of its ownership of stock, and in not holding that the Northern Securities Company was intended by its incorporators to be, and is, a device for evading the laws of the state.

Reception to New Couple.
