Special Excursion to the World's Fair.

The Denver & Rio Grande, in connection with the Missouri Pacific, will run a series of personally conducted excursions to the world's fair during June. These excursions will run through to St. Louis without change of cars, making short stops at principal points enroute. The first of these excursions will leave Portland June 7th, and the second June 17th. The rate from Astoria will be \$47.50 to St. Louis and return. The round trip rate to St. Louis and return from Portland will be \$67.50. Tickets will be good for return via any direct line.

A round trip rate of \$72.50 will also be made from Portland to Chicago and return.

If a passenger desires to take in both Chicago and St. Louis the round trip rate will be \$75.00.

All tickets will be good for 90 days from date of sale. Tickets will be good going ten days from date of sale so that a limited stop-over can be had on the going trip and on the return trip passengers can stop at their pleasure west of the Missouri river or St. Paul. These rates apply via direct lines, but if passenger wishes to return through California tickets can be sold accordingly, but at an increased rate of \$13.50 added to above.

WHERE WAS THE PARTY BORN?

In Maine, Say the Republicans of That State.

The republicans of this state believe that the birth of the republican party took place in Strong, Me., and not in Jackson, Mich., as republicans in the west assert.

The assertion of the Maine republicans is based on the fact that the Strong convention, which was held on August 7, 1854, was the first regular assemblage of delegates to any convention which recognized the word republican as the title of the party. According to the assertions of the Maine republicans, the meeting held in Jackson, Mich., July 6, 1854, was no more than a gathering of the anti-slavery elements of the state in response to a call for a mass meeting to take counsel regarding future action. The Michigan mass meeting passed resolutions, declaring those present as members of the republican party, a name suggested by Horace Greeley in the previous winter.

The argument presented by the Maine republicans is that when the prohibition and anti-slavery wings of the democratic party met in Portland June 7, 1854, and nominated Anson P. Morrill for governor, the presiding officer, C. J. Talbot of Oxford county spoke of forming a coalition with the old Whigs and organizing the republican party, dwelling upon the name at some length. At the close of his address the convention arose and gave three cheers for the republican party.

Maine's claim to having been the birthplace of the republican party has been held by leading republicans for years. On August 7, 1884, when James G. Blaine was a candidate for president and Maine was all on fire with enthusiasm, the 30th birthday of the republican party was celebrated at Strong with a great barbecue. Among the speakers were Mr. Blaine, Nelson Dingley, William P. Frye and Hannibal Hamlin of Maine and Julius C. Burrows of Michigan.

It was then that Mr. Hamlin said that if a mass meeting which had passed resolutions was all that Michigan could present he would see the meeting of July 6, 1854, held at Jackson, and go it a month better by citing the Portland convention of June 7, the same year, at which Chairman Talbot had recognized the existence of the republican party in a moving address, which had been loudly cheered. In conclusion, he said that as the Strong convention of August 7 was the first official party action to give approval to the name of republican, he should claim Strong as the birthplace of the republican party.

Mr. Burrows, who was then a representative in congress from Michigan, approved of the decision and said that he believed that Maine's claim was valid.
