

MARKET IS INACTIVE

Chickens and Eggs are Away Down in Price.

Smelt and Salmon Make Their Appearance in the Market Again—Fresh Meats Remain Stationary—Cheese and Potatoes Up.

Portland, Jan. 25.—The produce market still remains inactive, and poultry and eggs are cheaper than for some weeks. Ten cents was a good price for live chickens yesterday, and even at this figure many coops were carried over. Wild game is still abundant.

Smelt are in the market again, and there is also some salmon.

California tomatoes are quoted at \$2 the box, but there are not many in the market at any price.

There is no change in the prices of fresh meats, but cheese has gone up, and fruits and vegetables are generally advanced, especially potatoes.
