

PRODUCE IS STEADY

Smelt are plentiful and bring fair prices.

Large shipments of California fruits and vegetables arrive—Unusual demand for ducks for Chinese New Years about over.

Portland, Feb. 6.—There was nothing unusual in the local produce markets yesterday, unless it be the continuation of the big shipments of smelt from the Cowlitz river.

Several carloads of California vegetables and fruits were unloaded today, and will bring good prices.

It is likely ducks will be cheaper, the demand for these fowls for the Chinese New Year tables having slackened.
