MILLIONAIRE GONE

Mulford Martin a Wealthy Young American Disappears.

WAS HEIR TO A MILLION

Martin Made Friends Among the Chorus Girls of London and it is Thought They had Something to do with His Sudden Disappearance.

New York, June 2.—Details have just been received of a mysterious disappearance recently in Brighton, England, of Mulford Martin, a wealthy young American.

The young man's mother, whose home was in Rye, N. Y., married some time ago Dr. Walsh of San Francisco. Wanting to supervise her son's education, Mrs. Walsh accompanied him to Europe in the early part of last March. After visiting France, England, Ireland young Martin and his mother arrived at Brighton on April 28 and took a sweet of rooms at an exclusive hotel. Martin made friends among the chorus girls of a vaudeville pavilion, and early in May walked out on a pier with one of them. The girl returned to the pavilion for a short time, Martin having promised to await her on the pier. That was the last seen of him.

Scotland yard detectives have been working on the case continuously but so far have obtained no clue. A story told by an amateur thence medium to the effect that she has seen in a sance a man answering to Martin's description, bound and held as a prisoner in a strange house, has led to a minute search for the house. As yet, however, no such house has been located, and a general alarm has been sent out in Paris and through all the English cities. The missing man's guardian, who lives in New York, has received no drafts nor requests for funds since April 30.

Young Martin was to have come into possession of his fortune next November.

SHIPPING NOTES.

The steamer Elmore arrived in last evening from Tillamook and the steamer W. H. Harrison is also due from the same place.

The steamer Toledo sails this morning for Gray's Harbor points.

The steamer Roanoke is scheduled to sail for Los Angeles tomorrow morning. She will not call at Coos Bay on her return trip, because of such a large amount of freight having been offered for San Francisco and Los Angeles. She usually sails with not more than 900 tons, because of the fact it is thought impossible to enter Coos Bay with a greater draft, but when she goes out Saturday night there will be 1400 tons stowed away beneath her hatches.

The schooner Jennie Stella is on the way up from San Francisco.

The steamer F. A. Kilburn arrived in from San Francisco yesterday with a full cargo of freight and passengers. Barge Omaha was launched from the cradle at the Portland yards yesterday. She is owned by the Diamond Oil Co. and will be commissioned towing rocks from Bunker Hill to Ft. Stevens as soon as her gear is aboard.

Steam schooner Newport, recently purchased by the North Pacific Steamship Company, to go on the coast route, making the small outside ports, departed from San Francisco last evening. She will stop at several places and is not due to arrive until next Saturday. H. E. Ozorf, secretary of the company, is at Coquille, arranging for an agency, and will later establish others at Tillamook and Yaquina Bay.

The U. S. revenue cutter Rush arrived down from Portland last evening and will sail this morning for San Francisco. The Rush expected to be in the river for several days but yesterday morning she received orders to proceed immediately to San Francisco.

The British bark Dumpridshire arrived down yesterday and will probably go to sea today. Her cargo consists of 2,325,343 feet of lumber for Melbourne, Australia.

Discovery of Gigantic Efforts to Defraud the Government.

San Francisco, June 2.—The Examiner says today:

DANGEROUS DOINGS

French Spy Caught in the Employ of the Russians.

IMPORTANT LETTERS FOUND

Was Engaged by the Russian Government to Furnish Information of the movements of the Japanese Warships and was Assisted by his son.

Victoria, B. C., June 2.—Advices were received by the steamship Kanagawa that a strong case is being made out by the Japanese government against Captain Bergouin, a prominent Frenchman of Tokio, formerly of the French legation, who with his son-in-law and Japanese engineer in his employ has been arrested, charged with being a spy in the Russian service. Copies of the messages alleged to have been sent to Russian agents giving information with regard to movements of transports, warships, and troops were found in his residence at Tokio. It was stated that the transports Hitachi and Sado were intercepted and the former sunk a year ago by the Vladivostok squadron because of information furnished by Captain Bergouin. Strong protests were made by the French government regarding his arrest but no notice is being taken by the Japanese government, which has a strong case against the alleged spy.
