Portland, Aug. 23.—Potato dealers are preparing for considerable business when the shipping season opens up, though they do not expect as high prices as ruled last year.

Barley and oats are coming in more freely, and mills devoted to the manufacture of breakfast foods are now running on full time.

Prices have dropped since the new crop appeared, but producers seem willing to let go.

Oregon watermelons are being received daily from The Dalles, Rogue river and the Umpqua valley.

Tomatoes turns out to be scarce as a result of an unlooked-for blight falling on the vines of the coast. The crop is said to have been reduced fully one third.

Fresh chinook salmon is not expected in the market after next Thursday when the close season will begin, but fish dealers think Puget Sound silversides will be a good substitute.

Cheese is very scarce, and another advance of 1-2 cent took place today. Poultry sells well this week, and receipts have thus far been behind the demand.

Fresh eggs are firm. Receipts daily grow lighter.
