

### NO "SELF-MADE MAN"

Chicago Professor Declares Term to Be a Fallacy.

### SUCCESS DUE TO ABILITY

Efficiency Can No Longer Be Manufactured or Home Made—Competition Is Too Strong and Unusual Ability Commands Too High a Price.

Chicago, Sept. 26.—The era of the "self-made" man is on the wane. Efficiency can no longer be manufactured or home made. Competition of the present day is too much for the self made man.

So holds Professor Nathaniel Butler, principal of the school of education, department of the University of Chicago, who spoke yesterday at the closing session of the 20th annual convention of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew in Mandel hall at the University of Chicago. The subject of his address was "Education as a Factor in Efficient Manhood." Professor Butler spoke in the place of President William R. Harper, who was too ill to attend the session.

"The term 'self-made man' is a mere fallacy," Professor Butler declared. "The 'self-made' man's success is due only to unusual ability. Efficient manhood—the manhood that ought to be offered to the world—no longer can be home made. In this time of competition the world is willing to pay the highest price for the efficient man just as for the articles of commercial use."

Clifford Pinchot, head of the bureau of forest reserves, spoke on "Public Ideals."

"I feel incapable of expressing the importance of the creation of a public spirit among young men," said he.

"The one great thing that Theodore Roosevelt has done for the United States is not his services in the recent peace conference, nor the use of prestige of his office in behalf of decency. The vital and important thing lies in the change which he has brought in the attitude of young men toward political life.

"The time is not long past when it was not considered respectable to go into politics. I hope the time is not far distant when it won't be respectable not to go into politics. When this time comes, this country will do things in the world that was never done before."

### WIFE DESERTION INCREASES.

New York Passes Law Making Desertion a Felony.

New York, Sept. 25.—Wife desertion on the East Side has become so common that a movement was started yesterday among leading Hebrews of that quarter to check the evil. Organizations with this end in view are to be formed and a system of following up and causing the arrest of men who desert their wives and families, will be established.

It is intended that the real work of the organization shall begin at once, but that its best results will be effected early next year. An act has been passed by the legislature making wife desertion a felony, but it does not go into effect until the end of the current year. Under this act it will be possible to extradite deserting husbands from other states. All charity organizations on the East Side, which have been called on to care for thousands of women and children each year, will help in the campaign.

### CONVICT WILL HANG

Killed One of Folsom Prison Guards in Making Escape.

San Francisco, Sept. 25.—The supreme court of Sacramento county today sentenced Andrew Myers to the gallows for the murder of W. L. Cotter, a guard at Folsom prison. Myers was one of the 13 prisoners who escaped on the morning of June 4, 1903, after compelling Warden Wilkinson and the captain of the guards Murryp, to protect them from the fire of the guards.

### STREET CAR MEN MEET

Make Display of Electrical Appliances at Their Convention.

Philadelphia, Sept. 25.—More than 1000 men interested in the operation of street car lines, including manufacturers of street cars and appliances, will be here this week for the annual convention of associations interested in street railways. The organizations to meet are the American Street Railway association, the American Mechanical Electrical and Railway association, the Street Railway Accountants associations of Omaha, the American association of Street Railway Claim Agents and Street Railway Manufacturers association. The conventions will cover six days. A new feature of the conventions will be the presence of a large number of steam railroad officials, about 5000 invitations being sent to railroad officers. All the sessions of the associations will be held in the south pavilion of the Philadelphia museum.

In conjunction with the conventions there will be an exhibit on a large scale of street railway cars and appliances in the exhibition halls of the museum. About 75,000 square feet of floor space will be given up for exhibition purposes.

### CAMPAIGN IS OPEN

New York Democratic Leaders Take Active Charge of Fight.

### FUSION TICKET CONSIDERED

District Attorney Jerome Consults With Assistants Regarding the Plans for His Campaign—Three Candidates for Mayor Are in the Field.

New York, Sept. 25.—Campaigning for the control of the city administration for the next four years and for the election of the county and borough officers throughout the city will begin in earnest today.

Leaders of the democratic forces will take active charge of the fight for Mayor McClellan's renomination.

Delegates from the republican organization, the citizens union and the municipal ownership league will meet again tonight to make another attempt to agree upon candidates for mayor, controller and president of the board of aldermen. If it is successful the fusion ticket will be placed in the field by the city convention of the citizen's union on Thursday.

District Attorney Jerome held a consultation yesterday with his assistants regarding plans for his campaign. Interest is centered chiefly in the fusion convention tonight, the first that will have been held with the citizen's union since that organization bolted more than a week ago. Three candidates for mayor will probably be discussed, representing the three important fusion elements as follows: John Ford, proposed by the republicans and endorsed by the German American league.

Martin W. Littleton, proposed by the citizen's union.

Samuel Seabury, proposed by the municipal ownership league.

All these candidates are stated to be advocates of municipal ownership or control of public utilities.

### YOUNG BURGLARS CAPTURED

New York Passes Law Making Desertion Robberies in Sixty Days.

New York, Sept. 25.—Two youths, one 19 and the other 16 years old, were arrested as they were leaving an upper East Side theatre last night. They are charged with having shared in 59 burglaries during the past 60 days in one Harlem precinct. The younger lad declared himself to be the son of a prosperous confectioner. He said his companion and a third boy not yet captured had made way with the proceeds of their robberies. They had used him because of his smallness to climb fire escapes, crawl over transoms, and to enter apartments by way of the dumb waiter shafts.

### GREAT ENDURANCE

Two Bullets in Brain, Three in Body, yet Will Recover.

### SHOT BY A FREIGHT THIEF

Rail Road Detective Engages in Battle With a Freight Thief Presents a Remarkable Case of Physical Endurance—Was Given Up for Dead.

New York, Sept. 25.—After the removal of five 38 calibre bullets from his body Joseph Guidivinski, a railroad detective shot August 18th in a battle with a freight thief, was pronounced yesterday to be on the road to recovery. The detective, according to the hospital surgeons, presents one of the most remarkable cases of physical endurance that has ever come under their care. After his battle with the thief, Guidivinski was believed to be dead, but he was driven three miles to Fordham, where it was found he was shot over the right eye while another bullet had entered the forehead near the left temple, two lodged in the abdomen, and a fifth struck the left thigh, piercing the bone.

He revived and was put on the operating table. After three hours work two bullets were removed from his head. Two weeks later an attempt was made to reach the bullets in the abdomen. One had lodged in the wall of the stomach, but the other was in the spleen. This necessitated a long and extremely difficult operation. Two minor operations followed and the last piece of lead was removed yesterday.
