Portland, Oct. 7.—Firmness in dried fruits follows advance in canned fruits, and still higher prices are expected.

Evaporated peaches advanced today to 11¢ 11/2 per pound, and it is thought evaporated apples, apricots and prunes will follow suit in the near future, as the supply is conceded to be short.

Front street stores bore a cleaned-up appearance today, and little or no perishable stuff will be carried over Sunday.

Poultry has been pretty well cleaned up this week, but prices had to be shaded a good deal in order to avoid keeping chickens over Sunday.

Butter continues to pile up on Front street, and fresh cream is in heavier receipt with the uptown creameries.
