gone insane. The only purpose of Langdon's suspension on the trumped-up charges is to bring to a halt the proceedings now under way to impanel a new grand jury, before which Langdon, assisted by myself, propose to present evidence which, in my opinion, will justify the indictment of the leading officials of the city administration and Abe Ruef.

"With the fullest sense of the responsibility resting upon me, I name among such corrupt and criminal officials Mayor Schmitz, Acting Mayor Gallagher and each and every one of the 18 members of the board of supervisors. I have evidence to prove these allegations and at the proper time and place Langdon and myself will lay it before the new grand jury.

"It is to prevent the exposure of their infamy that Ruef, Gallagher and the supervisors in their panic and fear of the felon's cell, have taken this utterly illegal step.

"This action will be resisted as a matter of course. The law of California is not so impotent that such a criminal conspiracy can possibly succeed. Whoever heard of such a proceeding before in any civilized community?

"San Francisco is now facing the greatest crisis any city in the country was ever called upon to face. The criminals have become the prosecutors. The situation has become appalling and every citizen who has a spark of manhood in him must do his duty and rise to overthrow the criminal power that has the municipality in its grasp. I do not think the people of any city in the world were ever forced to meet such conditions as prevail here now. Unless the people realize these conditions and men do their duty as citizens, the civic life of the city is as good as dead."

BUILDING LOG RAFTS.

Several to be Built at Stella and Towed to Frisco.

PORTLAND, Oct. 26.—Preparations are being made to raft logs and piling from the Columbia river to California, on an extensive scale, next spring. Two huge cigar-shaped rafts are building at Stella, to be towed to San Francisco when the winter storms are over. Each will be 700 feet long and will contain close to 10,000,000 feet of lumber. It is said that others of similar dimensions will be built this fall and winter.

Word has been received by the local agent that the steamer Nome City, which sailed from San Francisco last evening for Portland, is bringing 250 tons of chain to be used in the construction of the mammoth log rafts. The chain had been used on similar rafts already sent south from Stella.

DEVIL IS DEAD.

Chinese of Portland Cremate Evil Spirit for Last Time.

PORTLAND, Oct. 26.—Thousands of people are expected to turn out this evening and stay out most of the night unless driven home by the police, to witness the grand finale of the festival of the spirits now being celebrated by the Chinese of Portland. Some time before dawn tomorrow morning the evil spirit will be tied to the flames and with this pyrotechnic display the festival will come to a close.

It is generally admitted in Chinatown that this public demonstration will take place for the last time tonight in Portland, because the Chinese are becoming so Americanized and modernized that they no longer believe in putting up their hard-earned cash to be burned up in smoke.

JAPANESE SENTIMENT.

Objection to Importations Comes from Labor Element.

TOKIO, Oct. 26.—It is definitely learned here that the anti-Japanese feeling in America is confined to the labor element. The tone of the Japanese press is sobering down. Thoughtful Japanese believe that if the country allowed itself to be carried away by a momentary excitement against America this would only be playing into the hands of those who are anxious to alienate foreign sympathies from Japan. It is generally felt that the friendship between America and Japan is too deep-rooted to be sacrificed through local animosities.

RUSHING FOR MINES

Intense Excitement Among People at Walker Lake.

RESERVATION OPENED MONDAY

Camps Have Been Established and Hundreds of Prospective Claimants Are Preparing to Rush to the Promised Land.

YERINGTON, Nevada, Oct. 26.—Tremendous excitement prevails at this point on the northwestern side of Walker Lake, where between three and four thousand eager men have gathered preparatory to rushing on the Walker Indian reservation, a large portion of which will be thrown open next Monday.

Camps have been established at all advantageous points in this vicinity and the prospective claimants for mine locations are ready to rush to spots where the richest minerals are supposed to be. It is stated that the reservation is rich with gold and silver and a large mining camp and town will no doubt be built within a short time of the opening of the reservation.

WILL FIND POLE.

Explorer Peary's Wife Confident of Her Husband's Success.

NEW YORK, Oct. 26.—In a Portland, Maine, dispatch to the Times, Mrs. Robert E. Peary, wife of the explorer, is quoted as saying:

"I feel just as sure as I am living at this moment that my husband has found the north pole and that he will soon be home to tell us all about it." Mrs. Peary has spent the summer with her little daughter on Eagle island, an isolated bit of land in Casco bay, where the Peary summer home is situated. With her daughter she came to Portland yesterday.

"I do not expect to hear from him until the last of November," she continued, "but I will not be disheartened if I do not hear from him then. If he has not reached the pole I suppose he is in his winter quarters at Cape Hecla.

"On the last trip Peary was forced to turn back when within 250 miles of his goal owing to the lack of provisions. The Roosevelt will be able to plough 500 miles farther north than his other ships and this will give him just so much advantage."

CITY IS WIDE OPEN

Reverd Parkhurst of New York Makes Aggressive Right.

AGAMET DENS OF VICE

Parkhurst Society Will Demonstrate to District Attorney That Vice is Flourishing All Over New York City.

NEW YORK, Oct. 26.—Evidence of the "wide open" character of some parts of the city is to be submitted by the Society for the Prevention of Crime to the Police Department, in fulfillment of the promise made by Dr. Parkhurst at the Jefferson Market court on Wednesday. Evidence consists largely of reports of agents of the society who investigate complaints against pool rooms and dens of vice. Many of the reports will be in the form of affidavits when they are turned over today to Deputy Peace Commissioner Mathot.

The Parkhurst Society officials in order to demonstrate its charge that vice was flourishing, raided three alleged disorderly houses in the tenderloin precinct last night. The police later made fifty arrests. The raids caused a big sensation in the district. The police shake-up of yesterday will be followed by other wholesale changes. It is expected that every policeman in the city will be shifted. It is the most radical police shift the city has ever seen.

CARGO OF BIRDS.

Japanese Singing Birds and Parrots Arrive in New York.

NEW YORK, Oct. 26.—On the steamer Graf Waldersee, which arrived yesterday, was one of the largest importations of feathered live freight that ever came to this port. According to the purser there were 350,000 birds in the lot and they kept the region about the after hold lively all the way from Hamburg to Hoboken. Japanese singing birds and parrots made up part of the number, but the greater portion were canaries.

Republican Nominee for Secretary of State Arrested at Boise.

BOISE, Oct. 26.—Robert Lansdo, Republican nominee for secretary of state, was arrested today and bound over to the district court on a charge of embezzlement, alleged to have been committed while he was serving as assessor for Washington county. His bonds were fixed at \$1,000, which he promptly furnished.

JUMPED BAIL.

Murderer of Marshall Jett Has Skipped Out.

BEAUMONT, Tex., Oct. 26.—George M. Poole, who was arrested at Los Angeles yesterday, was charged with killing city Marshal Jett at Orange, Tex., in 1903, and by a change of venue the case was transferred to Beaumont, where Poole jumped bond and disappeared. He is a son of J. J. Poole of Orange, and belongs to one of the best known families in Oberlin, Tex.

STOLE A CIRCUS.

OMAHA, Oct. 26.—With the lurid idea of becoming proprietors of a small-sized circus, C. J. Larose and Edward Warren, two boys of this city, broke into a car of wild animals standing on a side track here late last night and made off with two lions, a tiger and three leopards. They got away with the plunder and later returned to the train with the intention of "biting" an elephant, but were detected and placed under arrest. Later the stolen animals were recovered from where they had been hidden.
