ZANGENBORG IN AMERICA.

Famous Denmark Actor Will Tour the United States.

NEW YORK, March 7.—Zangenborg, Denmark's leading actor, arrived here yesterday on the steamer United States from the Royal Theatre, Copenhagen to tour this country. He will be seen here first at the Plaza theatre on the night of March 13. Later he will go West.

A fellow passenger of Mr. Zangenborg was Otto Fick, originator of the idea of apartments where housekeeping is done on the co-operation plan. He has built several large apartments in Copenhagen, Stockholm and London, wherein the plan is said to have been conducted with success.

He believes there is an opening here for such houses in the United States and will investigate.

HIBBARD WAS DRUNK

So Heney Explains Granting of Writ of Error in Reef Case.

BAR ASSOCIATION TO PROBE

Action of Superior Judge in Interfering With Court of Co-Ordinate Jurisdiction Will Be Investigated—Reef's Attorneys are Blamed.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 8.—An exciting meeting of the San Francisco bar association was held tonight. About a hundred lawyers gathered to consider the action of Superior Judge Hebbard in granting a writ of error to Abe Reef while the latter's trial was pending in a court of co-ordinate jurisdiction. Assistant District Attorney Heney in a sensational speech declared that the actions for Reef was more reprehensible than the conduct of Judge Hebbard, in taking advantage of the latter's alleged condition to secure a writ to frustrate the progress of justice.

Attorney Dwyer spoke forcibly along similar lines. Attorney Ach of Reef's counsel denied that Hebbard was intoxicated. The grievance committee of the association will make a thorough investigation of the affair.
