THAW SEEMS DOOMED

Justice Fitzgerald Will Probably Appoint Commission.

ALL BELIEVE THAW INSANE

Noted Alienist Has Declared Defendant Is Now Incapable of Conducting His Own Defense—Others of Some Opinion.

Justice Fitzgerald will appoint a commission in lunacy to inquire into the present mental condition of Harry Thaw seems a foregone conclusion. This afternoon he will hear arguments of counsel on both sides of the famous case and he plainly intimated yesterday that he would appoint a commission. That this commission will find that Thaw is now insane is the opinion of most of those who have closely followed the trial.

Dr. Allan McLane Hamilton, one of the country's most famous alienists, has openly expressed the opinion that Thaw is now insane and that he is incapable of conducting his own defense. Dr. Carlos McDonald and Dr. Austin Flint, also noted alienists have expressed the same opinion, and affidavits are expected from all three, as well as from the doctors who are familiar with the history of the Thaw case and with the insanity which is said to be the cause.
