FUNERAL TRAIN.

Shriner Train Leaves San Francisco For The East.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 15.—The special train containing the bodies of 28 of the Shriners and others killed in the Southern Pacific wreck at Honda last Saturday, reached the Oakland pier at 1 o'clock this morning. After a change of engines it immediately left for Buffalo and Pennsylvania points over the Southern and Union Pacific, St. Paul, Wabash and Pennsylvania lines. It will run on special time and reach Buffalo Sunday noon, where a committee of Reading, Pennsylvania, Shriners of Rajah Temple, will meet the funeral party.

The train consists of a baggage car containing the 28 bodies, a composite car, a diner and one Pullman. The train left Santa Barbara with nineteen bodies and took on nine more on reaching San Luis Obispo.
