LOOKING FOR FIGHT

National Educators Will Try and Adopt New Charter.

DISTURBERS FROM CHICAGO

Claim That Educational Policy is Now Controlled by Council Separate From the Association. Father of This Situation Now in Penitentiary.

CHICAGO, July 2.—A big fight over the adoption of a new charter is scheduled to take place in the convention of the National Educational Association at Los Angeles next week and the leaders of the disturbance will be Margaret Haley and ninety members of the Teachers' Union of Chicago.

Miss Haley and her followers who will control the vote of the Illinois delegation, departed on a special train over the Burlington last night. On a Santa Fe train which left earlier were 40 Chicago public school principals. According to Miss Haley, the committee was appointed by the Asbury Park convention which instructed merely to reincorporate the organization. "Instead of following instructions," said she, "the committee got Congress to pass a bill giving the session a new charter which included a set of bylaws. This has proved extremely objectionable in many ways. It not only continued the life directors, but there are more often than there are state directors. The five trustees elected by the directors have more power than the present constitution allows. They are the custodians of the \$147,000 fund and have sole initiative in the expenditures. The directors have none.

The educational policy is controlled by a council which practically is separate from the association. This council manages to perpetuate itself. In 1894 Frank Fitzpatrick of Boston, agent of the American Book Company was the counsel.

Miss Haley asserted that the present author of the situation was Thomas Dougherty of Peoria, now serving a penitentiary term for embezzlement and forgery. Dougherty for several years was an officer and leader in the association.

WILL BE BURIED TODAY.

Last Sad Rites to be Held Over Francis Murphy.

LOS ANGELES, July 2.—The body of Francis Murphy, "Apostle of Temperance," will be buried at Rosedale cemetery, Wednesday afternoon after services at the Simpson Auditorium where the body will lie in state for three hours. Men prominent in the affairs of Southern California, who have been associated with the dead evangelist in his temperance work will act as pall bearers.

Addresses will be made by Rev. Dewart Talmage, Dr. Robert J. Burdette, and Dr. Robert McIntyre.

By order of the Mayor, flags throughout the city will be displayed at half mast. A remarkable tribute to the memory of Dr. Murphy is the movement, instituted by liquor men, to close all saloons in the city during the hours the body will lie in state. A public memorial service will be held next Sunday.

Hon. Robert S. Murphy, Lieutenant Governor of Pennsylvania and John Murphy, of Philadelphia, two of his sons, arrived tonight. A third son, William M. Murphy of Virginia, is expected tomorrow.
