WATERFRONT ITEMS

A Steamer to Take Columbia's Place.

LYNA AND HYRA BOTH IN

Crowds Anxiously Await Arrival of Elder Last Night—Wharves Thronged With Many People—Irene Sails Up the River Without Assistance.

The steamer Breakwater came down at 4:30 yesterday morning on her voyage to Coos Bay. She had a full list of passengers and a hold crammed with freight. One notable passenger aboard is spoken of in another column.

The G. A. Vosberg came in from Nehalem on Monday.

The four-masted schooner Transit is now loading lumber at Humes Mill. Keeping her company is the schooner Glendale.

The steamer Alliance was in from Coos Bay before noon yesterday. She had many passengers and a quantity of freight.

The gasoline schooner Evie came in from Silet, Or., on Monday.

The schooner Lillibonne (three-masted) left out for San Francisco. She will lie there to await a charter.

The schooner Irene which sailed in on Sunday and anchored off the wharves till yesterday, again set sail and started up the river without a tug. She is bound for Prescott. She has gone up literally of her own volition. She once before attempted the stunt but unfortunately ran aground some way up the river. She is not likely to get all the way to Portland, luckily, for if she did establish this dangerous precedent, Portland might at last have some excuse for calling itself a seaport.

The four-masted schooner Virginia will go up to St. Helens to load lumber as soon as a tug comes for her.

The Norwegian steamer Thyra passed up about 7 o'clock last evening. Captain Emkins was piloting her. She will load lumber.

About four years ago when the Thyra was here, she came down loaded with wheat and flour. She anchored in the lower harbor and had not been there long before she dragged and went ashore. She was got off with some difficulty.

Soon after the Thyra had gone up another large steamer was seen approaching. News that she was the G. W. Elder seems to have spread all over town for the Patrol wharf was crowded with people eager to see the rescuer of so many lives from the ill-fated Columbia. The crowds were disappointed, however, as the vessel turned out to be the Lyra (American steamer), 24 hours out from Puget Sound. The vessel was light and has gone up the river to load lumber.

It seemed that half the city was in the vicinity of the waterfront last evening watching in vain for the appearance of the G. W. Elder due on Monday, but which was delayed by the Columbia disaster. All sorts of rumors were afloat as to the time of her probable arrival and, in spite of frequently reiterated authoritative statements that she could not arrive before midnight, the crowd still lingered. All were in hopes of getting some more definite details of the terrible catastrophe near Shelter Bay.

The gasoline launch Alexander, built by J. M. Leathers, was officially measured yesterday. Her tonnage is 12 gross and 8 net. She is 98 9-10 feet long and 13 feet wide and her depth is 3 feet. She was built for J. M. Alexander & Company of Aberdeen and will be taken to Gray's Harbor today by Knud Bull of Hoquiam.
