**RATE LAW UNCONSTITUTIONAL.**

Governor Of North Carolina Gives Views  
Regarding Clash On Rate Law.

NEW YORK, July 24.—R. B. Glenn, governor of North Carolina in a telegram received here gives his views on the clash between the federal and state courts regarding rate laws adopted by the state of North Carolina. He said:

"Our state contends that its rate law is constitutional; that it is confiscatory of the property of the railroads and that penalties and indictments against parties violating the law are just as right. The federal court, without finding that the act was unconstitutional and the rate confiscatory, has attempted to stop all proceedings whatsoever in the state court, even stopping indictments therein made.

"Our courts having jurisdiction, we contend, have a right to proceed to final judgment and that if aggrieved defendants can only appeal from our Supreme Court to the Supreme Court of the United States. This is the orderly method the railroads desire to enjoin us from taking, and take all cases into the federal court.

**HATTERS OF AMERICA**

Conference Between Executive of  
Honor and Association.

**AGAINST THE USE OF LABEL**

President John Moffit of the United Hatters of America Would Not Predict Whether There Would Be War Or Peace—Situation Serious.

Conferences between the executive committees of the Union and the Association held at the Broadway Central, at which attempts were made to settle the trouble have thus far been futile. The manufacturers have asked for further time and will make a final decision Friday. A majority of the manufacturers, it is stated, are against the use of the union label.

President John H. Moffit of the United Hatters of America would not predict whether there would be war or peace but said that the situation was very serious.

It was stated for the union that if the label is discarded the strike will take place.

**FORTUNE OR MISFORTUNE?**

Frank Morehead Fell in Pit and Found Silver and Jewelry.

New York, July 24.—The misfortunes of Frank H. Moorehead, of Fairfield, N. J., yesterday, resulted in his becoming possessor of a bag of gold and silver. Moorehead was on a fishing trip before noon time he had stepped in a hole and sprained an ankle, upset a canoe and nearly drowned. With no fish, he was making a short cut for home. It led him through grounds where a cottage was burned four years ago. Briars hid the path and the cellar excavation. He tumbled into the cellar and got up to vow that he would never go fishing again.

Then he saw a silver sugar bowl nearby, investigation disclosed more silver including big and little pieces and in a crevice was a black box. It contained watches and many rings, some of them set with diamonds.

The goods found by Moorehead are valued at from \$2,500 to \$3,000 and are supposed to have been hidden by thieves.

**INDUCING PRESIDENT.**

Postal Cards Mailed Teddy Urging Him to Accept Another Term.

NEW YORK, July 24.—From all parts of the country President Roosevelt has, during the last few days, received postal cards urging him to reconsider his declaration of 1904 and accept another nomination for the presidency. They are rather elaborately printed, containing a picture of the White House, under which is the inscription, "Uncle Sam Will Renew the Lease."

Printed in Philadelphia, the cards have come from many states, and the growing flood of them indicates that someone has started a campaign to induce the President to change his mind.
