NO BABIES IN HOMES

Stork Pays Few Visits to Evans-ton's Wealthy.

MORE WOMEN THAN MEN TOO

Census Shows That The District Will Soon be Depopulated And That There is Already a Steady Increase of Females And Decrease of Males.

CHICAGO, July 31.—Evanston, North Shore city of wealth, pride of the wealthy and cultured, is gaining feminine population, is losing her masculine inhabitants and is confronted with race suicide.

This situation was revealed yesterday with the completion of the city's annual school census. The figures showed an increase of 470 in the feminine population, a decrease of forty two in this number of masculine inhabitant and an increase of only seven in the number under 21 years old.

In part of the city given to luxury which furnished a population of about 12,000 in school district No. 75, there were just about the same number of children that there were in the 5th and 6th wards, which furnished only 4000 people. Mr. Victor McCulloch, the census taker, who is a Northwestern University student, said that even this showing in the wealthy homes was much better than it would have been had it not been that the maids and other servants under 21 years of age were included as among "The children." The total population is 24,324 and the census shows that there are 1908 families in the town.

FUNDS FOUND IN TRUNK.

Wealth Sent in Reckless Manner Finally Reaches Right Owner.

WATERTOWN, Wis., July 31.—A trunk containing securities to the value of \$200,000 has been found here and is now on its way to the rightful owner. Otto Heineken, a teacher in Emmanuel Church school, went to Chicago, and there left a call with the express company to get two trunks to be sent to Watertown. In some way the driver mixed the trunks in his load and sent one that should have been left at the depot in Chicago to Watertown and left one of Mr. Heineken's trunks at the depot.

Mr. Heineken did not return until Tuesday when he found he had a trunk which did not belong to him. He notified the company and the trunk for which a hot search had been made by the express company was forwarded to Chicago.

SPORADIC REVOLUTION.

HAVANA, July 31.—In an official report of the disturbance at San Luis Saturday night says it was a continuation of the recent revolutionary attempts here. The number of would-be insurgents was small and they scattered when the rural guards approached.
