## POOR FISHING IN ALASKA

LOCAL FIRMS RECEIVE ADVICES OF SEASON'S CATCH OF ALASKA REDS—FIFTY PER CENT BELOW AVERAGE SEASONS.

Private telegraphic advices from Alaska have been received by the Samuel Elmora & Company of Astoria in respect to the salmon pack for Bristol Bay, Alaska, for the season of 1907, which has just closed. The total amount is 710,000 cases, distributed among the following canneries and a few others not named:

Alaska Packers' Association, 422,000 cases; Columbia River Packers' Association, 26,000 cases; Alaska Fishermen's Packing Association, 26,000 cases; Warren Packing Company, 26,000 cases.

The catch this year is only 50 per cent of the average catch of former years and is the smallest since 1897. The shortage of Alaska reds is explained in the backwardness of the season, cold and foggy weather, with heavy winds, and a generally bad condition of affairs for good fishing. Besides this the fish were scarce in all parts of Alaska.

### BIDS OPENED.

Committee on Streets and Public Ways Open Bids on the Improvement of Several Streets.

The committee on streets and public ways of the City Council met at 4:30 yesterday afternoon and opened bids for the following improvements: Harrison avenue from Eighth to Twelfth streets; Irving avenue from Ninth to Eleventh; Tenth street from Grand to Irving avenues.

The surety's estimate on this work was \$18,728.00 and the lowest bid was by Heggerty Bros., \$18,655.75.

Irving avenue from Eleventh to Fifteenth, the estimated cost of which was \$9,608.55, E. A. Gerding's bid of \$10,765.20 was the lowest.

On the Fourth street sewer estimated at \$200 Charles Larsen was lowest with a bid of \$173.65.

The committee will recommend that all these bids be accepted.

Bids for improving Duane street from Lincoln avenue to Hume avenue and Hume avenue from Duane street to Commercial street being above the surveyor's estimate, the committee will recommend that these bids be rejected.

### MCKENZIE RIVER HATCHERY.

That the state is doing everything in its power to conserve the fishing industry can be learned by a short acquaintance with Master Fish Warden Van Dusen and listening to what he has to say concerning the business. With every cent of available appropriation which the state allows this department the fish warden's office is spending it as judiciously and as economically as well may be.

One of the new stations which is looked to for excellent future results is the one on the McKenzie river. This will distribute fry to the Willamette river above the Oregon City Falls and insure the small fish a large body of water for them to grow in before they drop down to the sea. No fishing is allowed above the falls and for this reason the fish will have a chance to live. But the only danger that small fish are subject to is the man with a hook and line and a part of the work to be done by the McKenzie is to raise these game fish for the upper waters of the Willamette. But every fish that is turned out from the McKenzie will find its way to the sea and later on return to assist in the fish industry by being caught in a net in the Columbia River.

### GOLD STILL IN KLONDIKE.

OTTOWA, Ont., August 3.—The Canadian government has had an examination made of the goldproducing districts of the Yukon to see what amount was still to be obtained from gravel banks, hillsides and valleys where the pioneer miner with placed methods has skimmed off the rich cream. Four experts spent a season sampling, surveying, boring and measuring the gravels. They estimate that there is almost \$67,000,000 in gold to be taken from gravel which has already yielded \$119,000,000 to recover what is still scattered through the soil advanced methods will have to be used.
