TWO CAPTAINS ARE FINED

INTERNATIONAL TUG-O-WAR RULES HELP TO SWELL REGATTA FUND AND FURNISH AMUSEMENT FOR CROWDS DURING PRACTICE.

An incident which happened Thursday evening last will give some idea of the rivalry existing among the tug-o-war teams which will fight for championship honors during the Regatta next week. It occurred while the American tug-o-war team was practicing in the hall at the Lurline dock.

Captain Martin Franciscovich of the Austrian team, presumably without thinking of the rules of tug-o-war or anything else except to see a good pull, walked into the hall as he would into his own residence, forgetting the fine which is subject to each captain for looking at another team while it is in training.

After a couple of rounds, Captain Eigner of the American team filed a complaint against the Austrian captain to the manager of the International Tug-o-War Association, who at once called Captains Johnson, Bjorkland, Lahti and Papadojlo together. The fine imposed on Captain Franciscovich was \$5, and the captain wanted to know if Captain Eigner knew he was present while he was pulling.

"Yes, I saw you here," replied Captain Eigner.

"Then why did you not tell me there was a hole in the wall," demanded Franciscovich. "I move that Captain Eigner be fined for knowing that I was present and continuing to pull on the team at the same time."

This important decision was left to the board of captains, who decided that in order to stick to the rules they should both be found guilty, and they announced a \$5 fine on each of the captains.

The crowd which had been watching the practice laughed at this decision, but the two captains appeared to be the most pleased, because each had made the others pay a fine. In spite of the loss they declared that they knew where they would get their next meal.

A SERIOUS ASSAULT CASE

R. P. DAMATIO ASSAULTS JACOB THURSTON—BOUGHT BEER AND IS THEN ASSAULTED WITH BRASS KNUCKLES.

Jacob Thurston was the victim of a vicious and unprovoked assault in the lower part of the city on Thursday night. It appears that he entered a crib in that district and having an unquenchable thirst proceeded to buy beer. He kept it up until he had expended nearly \$15 at a rate of one dollar per bottle and then declared that he was out of money and could buy no more. The fair siren who had lured him on to his beer buying extravagance was not satisfied with the declaration and soon discovered that the victim had \$60 more in his possession. He was finally prevailed upon to send the woman out for more beer and he handed her a \$20 piece to pay for it. When she returned she had several bottles of beer but no change for him. Beer at \$20 a bottle seemed to be too much for Thurston and he immediately filed a vigorous objection. About this time R. P. Damatio, a burly ruffian who

has been living with the woman, made his appearance from some dark corner of the crib and proceeded to administer a terrible beating to the unfortunate Thurston. Using brass knuckles he cut and bruised him about the head and face in a fearful manner. Damatio was arrested on a charge of assault with a dangerous weapon and when brought before Judge Goodman yesterday asked that his case be continued until today which was done and the case will come before the court at 3 p. m. In the meantime Damatio is out on \$100 cash bail which he furnished.

The woman in the case, who is the notorious Molly Tracy, alias Mollie Gordon, was arrested and charged with vagrancy. In the police court yesterday afternoon she pleaded guilty and was fined \$60 with the alternative of 30 days in jail. On condition that she leave the city at once and not return the sentence was suspended but she will be held in the custody of the police department until after the arraignment of Damatio wherein she will be a witness.

Mollie Tracy was the wife of Outlaw Tracy who created such a sensation a few years ago and was the sister of his pal, Merrill, whom he killed through fear that Merrill would betray him.

Damatio has been working as a bartender in that part of town but of late has been doing no work.




