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### WILL FIGHT RATES

**Butter Manufacturers Opposed to Advance Freight Rates**

**R. R. TO CONTEST CLAIMS**

**A Butter Famine Promised by the Manufacturers if Fight Should Fail in Illinois—New Schedule of Tariff Unjust.**

CHICAGO, June 8.—Sixteen of the largest manufacturers of butter in this state will open the fight against the proposed advance of freight rates on cream and milk before the Interstate Commerce Commission next Wednesday. The advance in tariffs are to 125 per cent. A butter famine is promised should the fight fail. Commissioners Prouty and Harlan will hear the testimony and argument. The railroads will contest the claims of the buttermakers, declared the schedule to be fair. The manufacturers report represents the plants to be worth \$1,000,000.

They annually put out \$150,000,000 worth of butter, more than one-quarter of the entire output of the whole country. They pay the farmers of the Mississippi Valley states more than \$50,000,000 annually and spend more than \$1,500,000 a year on railroad freight rates.

### JAIL PRAYER MEET

**Ask Life Imprisonment for Herman Billik**

**SENTENCED TO HANG FRIDAY**

Waiting For Pardon From Governor Dineen—Billik Apparently Cheerful and Says if he Must go to the Gallows he Will Repeat His Innocence.

CHICAGO, June 8.—The Cook County jail was transformed into a house of worship for several minutes yesterday when 650 prisoners joined in prayer asking that the death sentence of Herman Billik be committed to life imprisonment.

The prayer meeting, without equal in the history of the jail, was entirely unpremeditated. Billik's wife and four children were visiting him. Just before they left, his daughter, kneeling near her father, started a prayer.

"O, God please save my papa," she said. Word was quickly passed from tier to tier from the women's ward to the "pen". The building, which a few moments before had been filled with coarse laughter and coarser talk, quieted down and even the most hardened criminals there offered up a word of prayer that Billik's life might be spared.

Billik himself, although he knows that unless Gov. Dineen and the Board of Pardons act in his case today, he will die on the gallows Friday, was apparently cheerful.

"I am confident that the Lord will take care of me", he said. "I am innocent of the murder of the Vezal family and I know Father O'Callaghan and others who have worked in my behalf have obtained evidence enough to cause the governor and the Pardon Board to save me from hanging.

"But if it is decreed that I must die, I will walk to the scaffold without fear and will repeat there that I am innocent."

### BUFFALO TO PANAMA

SAN FRANCISCO, June 8.—The naval transport Buffalo has left for Panama with 700 men of the Atlantic and Pacific fleets, whose time has expired or is about to expire. These men will be taken to Panama and sent across the Isthmus to Colon, where another naval transport will convey them to the Atlantic coast. The Buffalo will bring back to San Francisco 500 recruits from the eastern states, who are being brought to Colon on the transport to which the Buffalo will transfer her men.

### RETURNED TO LIFE

**Brings Back Heart Pulsations for Three Days**

**DR. WRIGHT OF BROOKLYN**

But For Pneumonia Resulting From the Uncovering of Lung Patient Would Have Recovered—Pulsation Restored by Manipulating Heart.

### NEW YORK, June 8.—

By manipulating the heart of a woman patient after it had ceased to beat, Dr. J. Sherman Wight of Brooklyn brought back pulsation and the woman began to breathe again. Respiration continued for three days and had not pneumonia resulted from the uncovering of the lung it is believed the patient would have recovered. It was during an operation for cancer involving the removal of the entire breast bone that Dr. Wight suddenly noticed that the woman had not only ceased to breathe but her heart had stopped beating. He pressed his fingers against the sac covering the heart and pressed it again and again. Gradually the muscles began to expand and contract. Dr. Wight continued to manipulate the heart until the circulation was re-established and respiration was restored.


