

The Daily Market Report

PORTLAND, July 6.—Abundance prevails in the Front street produce markets, and receipts seem inclined to increase in the vegetable and fruit line, though no diminution of prices is anticipated. California fruits are in good demand at prevailing quotations, though new apples are quoted at 50 cents a box lower than on Saturday. The prevailing price today is \$1.50 a box for the best specimens of the fruit received. Watermelons are in receipt at \$2.50 per 100 pounds; tantaloupes are coming by the carload from the interior valleys of California at \$1 to \$1.50 per crate; bananas are coming freely by way of New Orleans at 5 to 6 cents a pound; apricots are quoted at \$1 to \$1.25 a crate.




