

SLAP FROM BRYAN

Refers to President's Interest in Taft

ON ESTABLISHING DYNASTY

Nebraskan is in Full Control of the Convention and is Writing the Planks, Including One on Injunctions—Negro Question Up.

DENVER, July 8.—William J. Bryan's view as to what the democratic national platform should contain are fully before the sub-committee charged by the convention with the work of drafting that document.

Mr. Bryan's view on the injunction plank as thus transmitted are that the plank should begin with the statement that the party resents any attempted reflection upon the judiciary of the country; that not only are the courts themselves created by law, their jurisdiction and authority are defined by law, as well as their rules of procedure.

He has no objection to a plank endorsing state militias but prefers to be in the language of Thomas Jefferson on that subject—"a well disciplined militia is our best recognized defense".

IF A PLANK COULD BE DRAWN ON THE RIGHTS OF THE NEGRO THAT WOULD BE UNANIMOUSLY ACCEPTED Mr. Bryan would not object to it but he would not want to force such a plank in the platform.




