

The Daily Market Report

PORTLAND, Sept. 2.—The demand for best quality peaches continues strong at 75c to 85c a box for the most part, but the small sizes and common fruit are slower at 40 to 60 cents generally, and the supply of the latter is heavy and growing.

Some shading of prices has already been done in the poultry market, though the trade of the week has but fairly opened, and this is regarded as an unfavorable indication.
