

The Daily Market Report

PORTLAND, Sept. 19—This was about the dulllest day of the season in the fruit trade. Stocks of practically all seasonal lines were large, and in some, particularly peaches, pears, apples and grapes, the market was top-heavy. The fact that it was Saturday was also a weakening factor, for buying is always on a small scale the last of the week. There will be a heavy carry-over and the outlook is for a comparatively slow market next week.
