sion from you I would know how deeply you have been interested in my success and how much you rejoice in it. It is your administration that this victory affirms.—William H. Taft.

DANVILLE, O., Nov. 3.—Cannon's plurality is at least 10,500.

CINCINNATI, Nov. 3.—Harris, Republican candidate for Governor is defeated.

GUTHRIE, Okla., Nov. 3.—Bryan will have a plurality in Oklahoma estimated at 25,000.

PORTLAND, Nov. 3.—With five precincts missing out of 114 the vote in Multnomah county gives Taft 17,197, Bryan 9584, Chafin 604, Debs 1259, Hisgen 148.

NEW YORK, Nov. 3.—Taft has carried Maryland by 3000. Hughes has won by over 50,000. He came down to Greater New York with an indicated plurality of 121,000. Chanler carried greater New York by 68,000.

CINCINNATI, Nov. 3.—If the present ratio is maintained Taft will carry Ohio by 49,000.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—The President tonight sent the following dispatch to Taft: "I need hardly say how heartily I congratulate you and the country: even more." He then sent the following to Sherman: "I most heartily congratulate you." To Hughes: "Accept my heartiest congratulations for you and the state." To Hitchcock: "Accept by heartiest congratulations upon the great result you have done so much to bring about."

RENO, Nev., Nov. 3.—Republican Chairman Humphreys concedes the state to Bryan by 3000.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 3.—President and Mrs. Roosevelt returned to the White House this evening well pleased with the returns as furnished him by the Associated Press and telegraph companies.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 3.—The Republicans claim the state by over 300,000 for Taft.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 3.—The Democratic committee specially admits that California has gone Republican.

ST. LOUIS, Nov. 3.—Scattered returns indicate that Bryan carried Missouri by 35,000. Cowherd, Democrat, is elected Governor.

BOSTON, Nov. 3.—The Republican national and state tickets swept the state today.

OMAHA, Neb., Nov. 3.—The Bee claims that Taft has carried Nebraska by 12,000.

CHICAGO, Nov. 3.—Indications show that Taft carried the state by 170,000.

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Nov. 3.—Bryan carried the state with the usual Democratic majority.

In 1145 districts out of 3036 election districts in New York state outside of Greater New York give Taft 257,271, Bryan 183,708, Hisgen 2258. Same in 1904: Roosevelt 256,188; Parker 161,105.

In 980 districts out of 1633 Greater New York give Hughes 150,325; Chanler 187,823, Shearn 10,277.

In 1800 districts out of 3036 in New York state outside of Greater New York give Taft 360,239, Bryan 249,649, Hisgen 3222.

SEATTLE, Nov. 3.—Very meagre returns from the state and city. The plurality for Taft is over 30,000.

NEW YORK, Nov. 3.—If the present ratios hold Taft will come to Greater New York with over 210,000 plurality and Hughes will come to Greater New York with 103,000. In 175 out of 2611 precincts in Illinois, outside of Cook country, give Taft 27,000 and Bryan 17,350.

In 308 districts out of 587 Brooklyn give Taft 82,082, Bryan 78,815. In 339 districts out of 891 Manhattan and Bronx give Taft 59,560, Bryan 68,914, Hisgen 5976.

In 856 districts out of 1633 Greater New York give Taft 150,265; Bryan 146,127, Hisgen 15,073.

In 956 districts out of 1633 Greater New York give Taft 168,784, Bryan 162,957, Hisgen 16,742.

At 8:15 Hitchcock filed congratulatory messages to Taft and Sherman and claimed the state for Governor Hughes.

At 8:30, if the present ratio holds good, Chanler's plurality in Greater New York will be 75,000 and Hughes will be elected by over 25,000. Taft will come to New York with 210,000 and Hughes with 103,000.

At 7:45 Democratic Chairman Connors said: "I claim the state for Chanler. His plurality will be at least 50,000."

Republican National Chairman Hitchcock said to the Associated Press: "I stand on my claim of 325 electoral votes for Taft. I expect Taft to receive not less than 100,000 plurality in New York and that Hughes has been elected."

State Chairman Goodrich of Indiana telegraphed the Republican headquarters that Taft carried Indiana by 15,000.

Hitchcock tonight received the following telegram from James S. Sherman: "Utica, New York, Nov. 3, 1908. Hon. Frank H. Hitchcock, chairman Republican national committee, New York:—Please accept my congratulations and thanks for success and wisdom with which you have conducted the campaign."

BALTIMORE, Nov. 3.—Returns from various parts of the state show a falling off in Democratic votes indicating that Taft has carried the state by 5000 or more. The Republicans probably elected three out of six congressmen.

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 3.—In 11 precincts out of 3245 in Indianapolis Taft received 2042 and Bryan 2030.

OHIO, Nov. 3.—There are 4430 precincts in Ohio and not a precinct had reported at 7:50 p. m.

CINCINNATI, Nov. 3.—Taft cast his ballot, No. 371, at 4:41 this afternoon in a plumbing shop, 2009 Madison Road. A large circus, crowd of men, women and children surrounded the polling place.

CONCORD, Nov. 3.—The Republicans claim New Hampshire for Taft by 20,000.

NORFOLK, Va., Nov. 3.—The Republican state committee concedes Virginia to Bryan by 15,000.

DES MOINES, Iowa, Nov. 3.—Meagre returns indicate that Taft has carried the state by over 30,000.

BUFFALO, N. Y., Nov. 3.—Erie county is complete with Taft, 40,101; Bryan, 35,952; Hughes, 35,357; Chanler 40,913.

NEWARK, N. J., Nov. 3.—Republican Chairman Murphy claims a sweeping victory for Taft in New Jersey. Democrats make similar claims.

CHICAGO, Nov. 3.—With only 291 precincts out of 1260 in Chicago, Taft 150,955; Bryan, 108,584. This indicates that Taft ran ahead of President Roosevelt's vote of four years ago.

CHICAGO, Nov. 3.—Cannon is elected.

NEW YORK, Nov. 3.—The Times, World, Herald and Brooklyn Eagle announce the election of Taft.

BOSTON, Nov. 3.—The Globe, the Democrat newspaper, announces that Taft has carried Massachusetts by 100,000 and that Draper is elected by 75,000, as governor. Eleven Republican congressmen are elected. Both branches of the Legislature are Republican. Early returns indicate Taft's plurality at 120,000. Draper for Governor by 60,000.

NEW YORK, Nov. 3.—At 10:30 p. m., Hughes' plurality in New York state probably will be about 57,000.

FAIRVIEW, Neb., Nov. 3.—Bryan carried his precinct 106 to 52 for Taft.

FAIRVIEW, Neb., Nov. 3.—At 9:25 Bryan announced he will have no statement to make tonight.

WILMINGTON, Del., Nov. 3.—The Republicans claim Delaware for Taft by 3500 plurality.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Nov. 3.—The Democratic majority is about 18,000.

CHARLOTTE, N. C., Nov. 3.—The Democratic ticket will carry North Carolina by at least 30,000.

NEW ORLEANS, La., Nov. 3.—Bryan carries the state by about 40,000.

BOISE, Idaho, Nov. 3.—Meagre reports indicate Taft carried the state by about 20,000.

WHITE RIVER JUNCTION, Ver., Nov. 3.—Taft carried Vermont by about 27,000.

SIOUX FALLS, S. D., Nov. 3.—Scattering returns indicate Taft carried the state, ten to fifteen thousand.
