

The Daily Market Report

PORTLAND, Jan. 12—Flour prices were advanced 25 cents a barrel in the local market today, the lift following an advance of 35 cents at Seattle yesterday. The two markets are now at parity. The present strong wheat market and the upward trend of values, especially in the case of milling bluestem, which was raised to \$1.05 in the local market today, made higher flour quotations necessary.
