TELEGRAPHIC. WASHINGTON, Sept. 19.—The secretary of the interior has received a communication from the general council for the Northern Pacific railway company informing him that the company on the 18th inst. paid the treasurer of the United States \$20,123, the cost of surveying, selecting and conveying 743,906 acres of land in Minnesota, for which patents were issued to the company in 1873. This payment is in accordance with the decision of the interior department on June 6th, 1882, but was made under the protest and without waiving any of the company's rights.

ST. LOUIS, Sept. 19.—The damage by a collision and fire at the tunnel west of Kirkwood on the Missouri Pacific railway, yesterday, it estimated at \$50,000. Sixteen or twenty cars, some of them laden with lumber, and one large locomotive are burned, and the walls of the tunnel badly broken and damaged by heat. It will take several days to get the track and tunnel in working order. Meantime trains will be run on the Wabash track, and the business of the road will suffer no detraction.

NEWBURGH, Ont., Sept. 19.—A terrific storm this afternoon destroyed the tannery and Madden's cheese factory; a number of other houses were unroofed. The steeple of the Methodist church was blown down and a summer house was lifted from a lawn and carried forty feet and was sent crashing into the side of a church. Two barns were struck by lightning and burned. Trees were uprooted and fences were demolished.

GREENFIELD, Mass., Sept. 19.—In a collision between two freight trains on the New Haven & Northampton railroad, Conductor Phillips and a brakeman named Curtis, and a fireman named Eyles-ton, were killed. Both engines were badly smashed and several cars were wrecked. The collision was caused by the disobedience of the conductor who escaped unharmed.

LINCOLN, Neb., Sept. 19.—A vast prairie fire is raging in the western part of the state, on the table land between the Platte and Republican rivers, to-day, with disastrous effect to the crops and grass. No loss of life reported, though two men were fatally burned some days ago on the North Platte, which is a heavy cattle grazing section, and unless rain comes great loss will follow.

DETROIT, Mich., Sept. 19.—Walter Dunn, of Tabowann, while resisting R. W. Wilson, in an attempt to take some wheat, he (Wilson) had bought at execution sale, whereon Dunn was the defendant, fired five shot at Wilson, three of which took effect. It is thought that he cannot live. Wilson fired one shot in defense hitting Dunn on the head. Dunn is reported to have escaped.

CINCINNATI, O., Sept. 19.—Samuel Voght, a German laborer, was found yesterday in the river at Hamilton, Ohio, with a bullet hole in his head. He had not been seen since last Friday, when he had \$1,000 in his possession, and was about to return to Germany. His money and watch were gone when he was found.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 19.—A new comet was watched at the naval observatory this afternoon, found in right ascension 11 hours, 19 minutes, 32 seconds, declination 12 minutes north. The comet was easily seen with the naked eye, and exhibited a short tail with bright head of considerable length.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Sept. 19.—Chas. A. Ketchum, clerk at the Alton elevator, has been arrested for stealing wheat. He employed an expressman for large pay to carry wheat away from a loaded car. The operations extended over several months and the amount stolen is probably several thousand bushels.

BOSTON, Sept. 19.—The democratic convention nominated B. F. Butler for governor, Samuel Bowman for lieutenant governor, D. X. Skillings for secretary of state, Wm. A. Hodges for receiver general, and John S. Sweeney for auditor.

WATERBURY, Sept. 19.—Rev. Lawrence Walsh, treasurer of the Irish national land league, will to-morrow cable Treasurer Eagan at Paris a check for \$29,000, covering the contributions from May 1 to date.

SARATOGA, N. Y., Sept. 19.—Collector Roberts of New York, telegraphed to come on by supporters of Secretary Folger and Congressman Skinner, has been brought forward as a candidate for governor.

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Sept. 19.—John C. Mathews, assistant yard master of the Providence and Worcester railway, and Henry M. Stone, switch man, were arrested to-day for robbing freight cars.

He used the rifle used by McVitch in the international contest. Col. Sanford shot with Sir Henry Halford's rifle, and made 74 points.

TORONTO, Sept. 18.—The government inspector here states that the ill-fated steamer Asia, was running without license, having been refused one on account of carrying an insufficient number of life boats and life preservers.
