LATE DISPATCHES. LONDON, Dec. 8.—The fire which broke out last night in the premises of Foster Parke & Co., wholesale druggists, on Wood st., was greater than that which occurred in London since the celebrated Tooley street fire.—The whole block between London wall, Phillips Lane, Adelle st. and Wood st., except the warehouses on the corner of London wall, has been destroyed. The fire is not subdued and the remainder of the block is still in danger. It is believed that eight persons were injured more seriously. Foster, Porter & Co., had a stock of silk goods, estimated at £600,000 sterling. The salvage Co. succeeded in saving a large amount of goods. The walls of the warehouses burned on Wood street, and Phillips Lane fell into the roadway with a crash like thunder, filling the streets with burning debris. At this hour the engines are still pouring volumes of water on the ruins and the fire is under control. It burnt over two acres. One fireman was killed by a falling wall. The total loss by the fire is now estimated at £3,000,000 sterling.

LATE.—Late to-night ruins still smouldering and streams from twenty hydrants pouring upon them. 500 persons thrown out of employment.

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 9.—Hutchinson, Kans. advices just received by the news from Kingman indicate a high state of excitement in that county over the alleged unearthing of a dark crime that slept for two years. It appears that two years ago a gigantic land swindle was in operation in that county and included in its active participants the sheriff and county attorney. The fraudulent scheme was discovered and all the parties arrested. Sheriff McClure broke jail and escaped while the county attorney Sprowl gave bail and suddenly disappeared from the neighborhood. It is supposed he had jumped his bonds. Rich relatives of Sprowl in Maine, fearing foul play from his confederates, sent a Pinkerton detective to Kingman some time ago to ferret matter out and result was the finding of a piece of charred cow on the farm of one Carr that had two bullet holes in it and it was identified as that of Sprowl's. Carr was one of the men interested in the land swindle and it is supposed that all hands interested in the case killed Sprowl to prevent his turning states evidence. Arrests has been made for some time.

WINNIPEG, Dec. 9.—A desperate attempt to escape from the provincial penitentiary at Stony Mountain was made by prisoners yesterday. It was a regular conspiracy led by Garvin, an American who was recently sentenced to 7 years for shooting McDonald in a bar room fight. Garvin came behind the guard, knocked him senseless, took his revolver and key and called on the other persons to follow. Warden Benson came at other end of the corridor Garvin fired five shots at him all missing Benson. Benson grabbed Garvin threw him down and disarmed him, receiving a severe cut in arm with knife that the prisoner had concealed. Guards appeared with rifles, and ordered the rebels back. Prisoners sullenly obeyed and all were soon under lock and key.

MACON, Ga., Dec. 9.—The passenger train which left Macon for Montgomery this morning ran off the track about one mile east of Georgetown at 4 o'clock this afternoon and the entire train was thrown 100 yards from the track down an embankment. Every person on the train except the engine crew was more or less injured. The mail agent, express messenger and one train hand were badly hurt. The injured passengers were sent to the hotel at Georgetown and medical aid procured.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 9.—McNamee, Pilet, Levi Chew and Robert Chew were arraigned to-day, for further hearing. Twenty-five police officers were present to protect the prisoners. Dr. Posters, demonstrator of anatomy at Jefferson college testified that he had never thought that he could be regarded as accessory to body snatching merely because he never made investigation of the manner bodies were procured, the college getting about 150 bodies a year. Students paid \$10 each for a ticket and one dollar each for every subject upon which they operated. Prisoners committed in default of \$5,000 each for trial.

MILWAUKEE, Dec. 9.—Henry Cary, defaulting clerk of purchasing agency of the C. & St. Paul R. R., was brought back by a railroad detective to this city to-day from El Paso Texas, where he had gone with a woman of the town. Railroad officials refuse to prosecute but will try to obtain the name of the confederate who drew money upon the forged vouchers.

CINCINNATI, O., Dec. 9.—Rosa Nolte, a girl who came from Germany a year ago, and who has been deserted by a young man to whom she expected to be married, laid down upon the track before an approaching train on the Cummingsville road to-night and was fatally injured She was soon to become a mother.

HARRISBURG, Pa., Dec. 9.—In the free college cemetery in the suburbs there are at least four layers of dead in the enclosure. The dead are only partially buried, many of them being uncoffined, and dogs have been feasting on the remains for years, portions of the bodies being dragged to neighboring farm houses.

CHICAGO, Dec. 9.—Capt. Black, democrat, is determined to contest the election for the congressional election in the 3rd district, west side, on the ground that Davis is elected by fraud and deception, Davis' name being printed on some tickets headed democratic. Davis' majority is about 2,000.

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 9.—This afternoon the boiler of Bay View Distillery, corner of 18th avenue and H street, south San Francisco, exploded and injured 4 employees, one seriously. The explosion fired the building but the flames speedily extinguished.

DETROIT, Dec. 9.—The counsel for Patrick Higgins, the alleged principal in the Huddy murders, set up the defense that the informer, Kerrigan, he said, had been corrupted by the teachings of the land league, is the author of the crimes committed.

NEWS NOTES. Henry Buck of Tower City has been arrested for attacking his wife with a knife. At Parker the blizzard was of terrific force, and the mercury stood 38 degrees below zero. The buildings erected in Grand Forks the past season amounts to nearly a half million dollars in value. Thomas B. Harris, accused of embezzling \$1,700 at Larimore, was acquitted by the grand jury at Grand Forks. Tom Crother's barn, with a fine horse and implements, was destroyed by fire near Esteline, Hamlin county, last week. Thirty hundred and ninety-two cars laden with beef cattle were shipped since January last over the Northern Pacific from Miles City. J. D. Benton has resigned the presidency of the First National bank at Fargo, and E. C. Eddy, formerly cashier, elected to the vacant position. Under the New York code a man was arraigned in New York city for attempting suicide. The penalty is fine and imprisonment for two years. A man in Deadwood made the statement that he had once beaten a fargo game until he actually felt sorry for the dealer, and he has been designated the boss liar. Two depraved Norwegians at Grand Forks pilfered wood from the door yard of two unprotected females, who suffered the pangs of cold from the loss of their fuel. The Grand Forks News, having secured the exclusive afternoon franchise of the associated press report, has abandoned the morning field and now appears as an evening paper. A feeling of peace and quietude has settled down over the government officials at Washington since it is stated there will be no more removals on account of the star route cases. A rumor was current in Washington on Saturday that the decision opening the Turtle Mountain region to settlement would be reversed. There is probably no foundation for the report. Judge Hudson, holding court at Grand Forks, says it will be impossible to more than half get through the calendar, which is an especially heavy one. A special term will be called in the spring. The Sioux commission has the consent of 20,000 Indians to the cession of a portion of the reservation. About 5,000 more are to be interviewed on the subject, and this will close the work of the commission. A remarkable woman has just died in Georgia. Her name was Mrs. Mary Austin, and her distinction consists in the fact that she is the mother of forty-four children, among which are six sets of triplets.

A scientific gentleman who has investigated the soil of Dakota territory, says it has been analyzed twenty-three feet below the surface and found to contain richer soil for the production of wheat and other cereals than the famous wheat lands of the Black sea.

Louis Sawady, the Marion postmaster who was taken to Yankton under charge of embezzlement, procured bail. He seems scarcely insane over his arrest, and deeded a piece of property to one of his neighbors without any consideration.
