Springtime on the Jim.

A boat ride upJim river shows thetrees have at last put on their light green spring millinery. The suffron blossoms of the elm are fairly out, and the plum trees have burst forth in fragrant whiteness. The slower budding alders still look bare, however, amid their green and white neighbors.

In these northern latitudes interest never ceases in noting how spring comes hesitatingly, step by step. A glance up the river that reveals bluff and bank and the trees that border the stream, discloses now, perhaps, the most attractive picture of the year. The season is young and full of promise. The delicate green color that has stolen on all the landscape, speaks of youth and hope and bushes that have patiently waited for this, their season of the year. The time between spring and summer is short, for the sunlight and shower will soon transform the delicate green tints into the deep, strong shades of summer and the early autum browns. Natures tremendous activities must needs work quickly, as they allow no time for byplay or sentiment in North Dakota.

The same familiar scenes along the I ttle river are to be seen at this season as in others. The water grass that branches into index fingers and points down stream is fringing the banks. The old water rat gives the row boat a close race up stream and when he sees himself beaten dives to avoid the disgrace of the finish. The crested kingfisher dashes wildly on ahead and stops at a deadwood etation on a projecting stump to again survey for minnows. A pair of businesslike snipe sail by close to the water and light suddenly by the river bank, with a quick turn and a short run. A couple of turtle doves on a dead limb seem surprised and agitated as the boat goes by. Red and yellow breasts flit through the trees, and the red winged blackbird sings his merry lay on a last year's weed stalk regardless of everything. Over the scene of welcome and security the shadow of a hawk is seen. His warning scream of disturbance and murder is heard as he disappears in the woods. ornaments will appear along the bank

Application Made For a Charter For a Second Jamestown Institution.

Application was made Friday for a charter for the Farmers' and Merchants' State Bank at Jamestown. Under the law authorizing banking business in this state the capital stock required is \$30,000. The incorporators and board of directors are all well known business men of this city and state. They are: State Senator M. F. Murphy and Stephen Collins, both well known business men of Grand Forks; John A. Martin of Carrington, machinery dealer and banker; Michael Murphy, a former resident of Jamestown and a member of the farming firm of Murphy Bros. in Foster county, also a well known real estate and business man lately of West Superior, and Charles A. Klaus of the Gladstone hotel.

The incorporators are men of fine commercial and financial standing and will enlist the confidence of the public in any enterprise started by them. The bank will occupy the corner room in the Gladstone block, which has an excellent vault built for that purpose, and business is expected to begin about August 1. The officers of the bank have not yet been selected. C. A. Klaus left for Bismarck today to secure the necessary authority to organize the bank under the state laws. .
