Duma Would Make Permanent Law Against Alcoholic Liquors.

Petrograd, July 1.—The Duma passed the bill permanently prohibiting the sale of drink containing more than one and one-half per cent of alcohol. The measure must be passed by the upper house and signed by the emperor before becoming a law.

According to the terms of the bill, strong drink means liquor containing more than 1-2 per cent alcohol and therefore includes light wines and beer. Amendments proposing a change in the definition of "strong drink" to liquor containing more than 1-2 per cent alcohol were summarily rejected by the duma and the bill was passed in its exact form as drawn up by the committee.

Passage of the bill by the upper house and its approval by the emperor will mean that all Russia will become a strict prohibition country.
