Many Sock Passage. Baltimore, July 12.—The North German Lloyd has received from persons in all parts of the country offers running as high as \$50,000 for the privilege of taking passage on the submarine Deutschland on the return trip.

Feeling secure in the belief that the state department at Washington will sustain the findings of the treasury and navy officials that the Deutschland is a merchant vessel, the agents today went ahead with plans for disposing of the vessel's cargo and preparations for its return.

Possible News Embargo. Washington, July 12.—If news of the departure of the German underwater liner Deutschland can be regarded as military information valuable to German enemies, the United States in its policy of neutrality will take steps to prevent such information from reaching them.

NO PRICE CUTTING SLOGAN OF COOPERS

Chicago, July 12.—The Associated Coopers' Industries of America was formed here by the amalgamation of the Slack Coopers' association, State Manufacturers of America, the Eight State Manufacturers' association, the National Coopers' association, and the Allied Coopers' Industries of America. The financial value of the annual output of the combined organization is estimated at more than \$150,000,000. Permanent headquarters were established in Chicago.

CITY SALOON NOT TO BE ATTEMPTED

Eau Claire, Wis., July 12.—Because, as they allege, an Eau Claire brewing company refused to let them have the building on which they had an option, Altoona's near municipal saloon, Altoona Mercantile company, has temporarily withdrawn from the field, and at the same time request their license has been revoked by the common council and licenses were issued to three other applicants who were turned down last day for municipal saloon. As a result, Altoona yesterday became wet.


