

## AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE EXHIBIT IS GOOD

One of the interesting exhibits in the Liberal Arts building at the fair grounds is that of the agricultural college at Fargo. Three departments of the work carried on at the institution

are shown by appropriate exhibits. These departments are the pure food department, the mechanic arts department, and the experiment station.

Several charts are exhibited to show the falsification of patent medicines. Fanciful names are shown to conceal very common ingredients, and a display of bottles shows how the capacity of the bottles are made misleading. An analysis of face powders is attracting much attention among women spectators. The men visitors are more

concerned over charts showing the analysis of gasolines.

The mechanical work shown includes a large assortment of tools and implements of common use on the farm. All of them have been made by students in their regular work in classes.

In the agricultural exhibit are shown grains, grasses and weeds of many kinds. There are shown more kinds of wheat than most people know there are in existence.

A formula for the eradication of gophers is one of the things which is attracting much attention. It is shown that the money spent by the counties of the state in paying gopher bounties could have been used to far greater advantage if even a fraction of it had been expended for poison. The formula given is: 1 oz. strychnine, 1 oz. starch, 1-8 oz. saccharin, 1-4 pint corn syrup, and 20 qts. oats. The exhibit is in charge of Prof. W. F. Sudro and Theodore Stoa, a student at the A. C.
