

FARM MACHINES SHOWN AT FAIR

Exhibit is Probably the most Comprehensive of Any Being Shown.

Appropos of the predominance of the agricultural interest in the state of North Dakota, the exhibit of machinery...

Almost every machine which the brain of man has devised as of practical use on the farm, is represented. There are tractors of dozens of makes, threshing outfits, plows, binders, drills, cultivators, mowers, cutters and blowers, numerous other machines for the use of the farmer, and an unusually large exhibit of labor-saving devices for that oft neglected partner of the farmer—the horse.

More firms are exhibiting this year than ever before. Many of them have branches in Grand Forks but there are also an unusually large number which come from a distance and show in this county or state for the first time. Some of the large exhibitors are in charge of high officials of the industry.

The first exhibit which attracts the attention of the passer-by is that of the J. I. Case Co. immediately to the right of the entrance gate to the grounds. This exhibit is in charge of August Hanson, state agent, and John Lundhagen, Grand Forks agent. A complete line of the well-known Case tractors is shown, including three gasoline tractors and one steam engine of the type so well known among threshers. The gas tractors are of 12-25, 10-20 and 30-40 horse power; the steam engine is of 28-80 horse power. This method of stating horse power means that the first figure refers to the power developed at the draw bar, and the second that developed on the brake.

This exhibit includes also a steel grain separator, complete with all the newest attachments, in full operation under the power of the smallest tractor. One of the objects attracting attention is the big Case 5, the racing automobile which lowered the mile record at Fargo the past week. A seven passenger automobile is also shown.

Hart-Parr Exhibit. The Hart-Parr people are showing tractors of four different ratings. The smallest of these is the 15-22, commonly known as the "Little Devil." All of these tractors use kerosene, and are among the oldest using this fuel for power. One of the interesting features shown in connection with this exhibit, is the "hold fast" lug which makes possible the use of the tractor in wet fields, according to the exhibitors. The Hart-Parr tractors are cooled by oil. E. L. Kirkpatrick is in charge of the exhibit.

Berg & Harris of Fargo, N. D., are showing two C. O. D. kerosene engines, of 12-25 h. p. These engines run on gasoline at the option of the owner. The Oliver plow shown by these exhibitors have a combination coupler and jointer attachment which insures the turning under of all of the stubble. An Autman Taylor separator and two Briscoe automobiles are also being exhibited by this firm.

Illinois Threshers. A 20 h. p. steam engine and a 22-52 separator are being shown by the Illinois Thresher Co. of Sycamore, Ill. This exhibit is in the personal charge of P. B. McIntyre, secretary-treasurer of the company. This is the first time that this factory has shown at the local fair.

K. T. Tractors. Two K. T. Tractors are shown by factory representatives of the concern, Harold Lundh, manager of the Kinked Tractor company of Minneapolis being in charge yesterday. This is a two-speed engine, burns either gasoline or kerosene, and has a rating of 12-25 h. p.

Steel Mule Shows. Fred M. Warner of Fargo is showing a Balco steel mule tractor. This is a 12-30 h. p. engine burning kerosene. It is water cooled. It is possibly the oldest of the tractors exhibited, being made with front wheels which can be variously spaced and having a caterpillar type of driving wheel.

DeLco Exhibiting. Frank LeDoc, traveling representative of the Northern Rock Island Plow Co., is in charge of several of the products of the company under the immediate supervision of local dealers. Geo. Sterling is showing the Peoria drill; Geo. M. Earle is showing the Heider tractor and Rock Island plows; E. O. Barlow is exhibiting the National steel grain elevator, and J. S. Schloesser is showing the Rock Island gas engine.

The Bull Tractor. One of the most interesting exhibits is that of the Cameron Bull Tractor Co. President P. D. Cameron of this concern is a Grand Forks man. He is in charge of the exhibit. The Bull tractor is the original small tractor and it is holding its own in the exhibitions all over the country. It uses either gasoline or kerosene and is water cooled.

Avery Exhibit. The Avery company of Grand Forks are showing a 25 h. p. steam engine and two separators. They also have a complete exhibit of tractors, ranging in power from the small 12-25 to the 40-50. This exhibit is attracting attention because of the unique system of cooling—it being the thermosyphon system, which requires no fan, and is trouble-proof, according to the statement of those in charge.

Kearns & McGuire. A very fine exhibit is shown by Kearns & McGuire of this city, through the assistance of the Domestic Engineering company of Dayton. Several applications of the power developed by the unit Delco-Light are shown. This little machine is shown making electricity for general service purposes. Dynamos utilizing the power thus made are used to turn churns, cream separators, washing machines, wringers and numerous other household machines. This exhibit is in charge of J. E. Logan of the factory, assisted by general agent for this state and a part of Minnesota, B. F. Ahelman. Mr. Logan will exhibit over the greater part of the west before he ends the season at Sacramento, Cal., this fall.

Other Exhibits. Among the large number of exhibits the following must be mentioned. The Interlocking cement stove silo, shown by the factory at Crookston, Minn.; the hog motor, an electrically driven machine whereby the animals grind their own feed, shown by the factory at Minneapolis; the Holland wild oats separator, and a very complete exhibit of iron work by the Northfield Iron company of Northfield, Minn. The last mentioned exhibit includes road graders, road drag, concrete mixer, a grain bin, steel tank, feed bin, etc. The Grand Forks representative of the company is B. L. Edwards.

In Machinery Hall are shown several products of the Staughton Manufacturing company, prominent of which is the low lift manure spreader. Here are also shown Empire and Iowa cream separators, Perfection milking machines, Garden City separator feeders and Chore Boy engines.

GERMAN BOATS GATHERING FAST. Amsterdam, Netherlands, July 26.—The German naval squadron at the Belgian port of Brugge has been considerably strengthened in recent weeks, according to the Amsterdam Telegram, and now comprises at least 21 torpedo boats and torpedo destroyers, including many of a new type with three funnels. Torpedo boats have frequently passed through the waters of Belgium, while German boats are said to have been transported from Germany by that route.
