She reached San Francisco after dark and was met by friends, who motored her to their country home on a hillside.


The next morning she walked out onto the breakfast porch quite prepared to be astounded with the grandeur of California.

STATE'S NET OF EVIDENCE TIGHTENS ABOUT ROY HINDERLITER, YOUTH CHARGED WITH "AIR BUBBLE" MURDER OF SWEETHEART

Olney, Ill., Aug. 5.—States attorney H. G. Morris of Richland county has in his possession startling new evidence which he believes will fasten beyond all doubt upon Roy Hinderliter, the wealthy Weabush county farmer boy, the odd "air bubble" murder of seventeen-year-old Elizabeth Radcliffe.

Briefly the new developments in the state's case are: Evidence has been disclosed showing that the girl was lured on her fatal buggy ride under the pretext that she was going to see "two doctors." On the morning of her death she received a letter from Hinderliter which she tore up and threw in the stove. This letter is supposed to have arranged the last tray.

On the same morning her sister-in-law, Mrs. Bert Fancher, suspecting the girl's trouble, wormed from her her secret. Elizabeth tearfully confessed.

A large number of letters written by the boy to the girl in the last few months are in the possession of the state's attorney, among them one mailed from West Salem on July 18, in which he spoke of the coming meeting, which was their last.

Dr. T. C. Weber of West Salem admitted he sold the boy an instrument last March or April similar to the one found near the scene of the crime, but denied he had instructed young Hinderliter how to use it other than for a personal physical ailment.
