BRITISH SOLDIERS MAKE BESRA A PORT OF REAL PROSPERITY

Besra, Mesopotamia, Aug. 2.—(Correspondence of the Associated Press)—This frontier city and river port of Asiatic Turkey, has since its occupation by the British in the present war, enjoyed more prosperity than in several years past. The city, says a British eye-witness account, is a green spot. It is like an oasis in a great desert. The date palms are festooned with vines which make a canopy, and fig trees and pomegranates with scarlet flowers, grow beneath. The very air seems to sweat, the weather is so warm. Strife and war it will burn fully without a flicker as if the flame were checked.

Besra was never so rich; money is pouring in, trade is brisk, prices are high. Three banks have opened. The Arabs of the city are learning luxurious ways; the four new theaters which have sprung up during the war have nearly met their demand for entertain- ment. And they are no longer content with their simple diet of dates and khobes (a coarse bread), but purchase English stores and eat pine- apples and salmon and biscuits and butter out of a tin.

The craft on the river are almost as hybrid and varied as the flora and fauna of the delta. The steamers, wattle-roofed shanty hatched on some primeval barge, which is very popular with the British soldier will always take off his hat. She used to be stoutly against the steps under London Bridge. For a penny she would take a passenger to Westminster or the Tower of London; and now, like others who are doing their part in the war, she has found her way to the Shatt-el-Arab under her own steam.

IRISH EMIGRATION SHOWS DECREASE

Dublin, Ireland, Aug. 12.—The Irish emigration returns for the first half of 1916 show a still further decrease on the 1915 figures. In the half year there were 3,073 emigrants, which is 985 less than for the corresponding period last year. The emigration is solely due to men, as emigration of women increased by over 600. One hundred and fifty-two emigrants were sent to the United States of America. As usual Ulster has most emigrants and Munster least.

FLAX WILL BE ONE OF BEST CROPS

Mandan, N. D., Aug. 12.—Flax will be one of the best producing crops of this season, reports from every portion of the western section of the state indicating that the situation with respect to flax is very satis- factory. Weather conditions continue very favorable to the growth of flax, as well as of corn.

Supreme Court Decisions

From Pierce County. The Hodge Heirs and their guardian, by their local agent, A. H. David, plaintiff and appellant, vs. Anolph Allickson, garnishee de- fendant and respondent.

Syllabus: (1) Under the provisions of section 7568 of the compiled laws of 1913, an issuance of the execution in behalf of a creditor against a garnishee defendant when the garnishment is in aid of such execution and it is not sufficient to merely deliver it to the plaintiff's attorney, and file a copy of the same with the sheriff or constable for execution.

(2) The right of garnishment is merely a statutory right and one who seeks to avail himself of it must conform to the provisions of the statute. Appeal from the district court of Pierce county; A. G. Burr, J. Judgment for garnishee defendant. Plaintiff
