CATTLE TRADE ABOUT STEADY

Market for Killers Shifts Very Little During the Past Week.

South St. Paul, Aug. 14.—Very few new features cropped out in the fat cattle at this point during the past week. While some fireworks were being staged, the market was about steady.

Sellers' attempts to make a talking point for higher prices out of the reported improvement in the eastern dressed beef market brought out the retort from buyers that carcasses of grassers were not moving any more freely or at any appreciable advance in price.

Most of the steer purchases made by packers last week cost between \$8.00 and \$7.50. They were called upon to help stock and feeder salesmen out of a bad mess by taking a lot of fat to trashy property out of the latter's hands.

Most of the calves were run true to form in respect to quality and classed about even with the mediocre steer quota. The \$5.00 to \$6.50 basis prevailed for majority of the female calves.

Several loads of Montana steady arrive on through consignment. Prices on veal calves here were steady. Estimated receipts were 500 cattle and 100 calves, making total for the week about 12,000 cattle and 3,500 calves.

Seven principal markets, including South St. Paul, had 177,000 cattle in five days last week against 144,000 the same days the previous week and 146,000 the corresponding time a year ago.
